## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steadier, mostly barely steady to steady entering the weekend. Demand was light to moderate, occasionally good in spot locations. Supplies ranged adequate to ample for current trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient to mostly ample for the light demand. Breaking schedules were about normal to heavy. Light type hens were about adequate to adequate for the moderate demand.

**MIDWEST REGIONAL EGG** Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were 2 cents lower for the larger sizes and unchanged for small with the balance of prices unchanged. Trade sentiment was mostly steady at current price levels. Retail demand was reported as slightly improved and rated as light to moderate, instances good. Loose egg sales were fair to good. Supplies were easily adequate to ample.

Trade sentiment was barely steady for whole egg and yolk and steady to barely steady for whites. Liquid whole egg demand was fair with white and yolk demand fairly good to instances good. Offerings were adequate to available with whites held confidently. Breaking stock prices were lower when compared to the previous week's reported prices.

**NATIONAL DRIED EGG REPORT** Prices were all lower to sharply lower when compared to a week earlier. Demand was moderate with interest improved for generally current deliveries. However, markets were unsettled and mixed but usually the trade sentiment was steady to weak on whole, about steady on yolks. Overall, most companies were sold out on albumen but prices had trended lower. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 01 May 2004 were 22 % more than the previous week, and 60 % more than last year. The total year to date dried eggs produced were 17 % more than a year ago.

Shell Eggs Broken Up 13 Percent

**Shell eggs** broken totaled 160 million dozen during March 2004, up 13 percent from March a year ago.

March 2004 contained 23 weekdays and four Saturdays, compared to 21 weekdays and five Saturdays in March 2003.

During calendar year 2004, shell eggs broken totaled 448 million dozen, up 5 percent from the 429 million dozen broken in 2003. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2004 was 574 million pounds, up 5 percent from 2003.
