NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to the previous day's values. The market tone was barely steady to weak entering the weekend. Retail and food service demand was usually in a range of slow to fair. Supplies were sufficient to ample, mostly fully adequate to ample. Breaking stock offerings were tight to sufficient for the light demand. Breaking schedules were normal to reduced. Light type hens were more than adequate for the at least moderate demand. Processing schedules were mostly normal.

MIDWEST REGIONAL EGG Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were lower for large and medium and unchanged for small. The balance of prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was barely steady to mostly weak. Cartoned egg demand slow to fair, mostly slow with loose egg movement light. Supplies were fully adequate to ample.

Spent hens were more than sufficient for the at least moderate demand. Processing schedules were noted as mostly regular for the upcoming week.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 43 to 44.5 cents fob with pasteurized whites reported from 27 to 27.5 cents fob. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm for whole egg, unsettled for whites and barely steady for yolk. Demand was quiet for whole egg and whites with yolk demand slightly more active than previously noted. Offerings were adequate or available for yolk and balanced for whole egg and whites. Breaking schedules full-time to part-time with breaking stock prices ranging unchanged to 1 cent higher than last week's reported prices.

Trade sentiment was steady to firm for whole egg, cautiously steady to fully steady for whites and barely steady for frozen yolk products. Contractual demand was seasonally hand to mouth while spot movement of all frozen products was reported as extremely quiet this week. Breaking stock prices were slightly higher when compared to the past week's reported prices.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG Mostly prices were lower on albumen, but mostly values were unchanged on balance of items when compared to a week earlier. Demand improved in some locations, soft in others; overall interest was generally light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available. Trade sentiment was barely steady on albumen, and usually steady on balance, but some caution was noted. LTL volume was generally trading at higher levels. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 05-Feb-2005 were 8% less than the previous week, and 5% less than last year. The total year to date dried eggs produced were 16% higher than a year earlier. Wholesale selling prices, dollars per lb., in containers, Trucklot and less-than-trucklot volumes.

Shell Eggs Broken Up 7 Percent

Shell eggs broken totaled 169 million dozen during December 2004, up 7 percent from December a year ago.

December 2004 contained 23 weekdays (including two holidays) and four Saturdays, compared to 23 weekdays (including one holiday) and four Saturdays in December 2003.

During calendar year 2004, shell eggs broken totaled 1.93 billion dozen, up 6 percent from the 1.83 billion dozen broken in 2003. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2004 was 2.49 billion pounds, up 6 percent from 2003.
