NATIONAL EGG REVIEW



As the week began prices were unchanged to lower. As the week progressed, prices were unchanged on mediums and higher for the larger sizes in New York. Elsewhere prices were unchanged. The trade sentiment was steady to instances firm. Retail demand was moderate to good best around feature activity. Food service movement was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to tight on larger sizes and sufficient to at times long on lighter weights. Breaking stock prices were higher with checks and undergrades unchanged. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate while some producers hold product in expectation of higher prices. Demand was mostly moderate. Floor stocks were fully adequate. Schedules were full-time. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. Removal costs for light type fowl were mostly unchanged. Offerings were fully adequate to ample for the fair demand. Trade sentiment was steady. Removal prices ranged 1.5-9 cents, mostly 4.5-5.5 cents per head.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were 2 cents higher for large with the balance of prices unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to mostly fully steady. Cartoned egg sales were light to good, mostly moderate. Loose egg demand was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to tight for jumbo and extra large, in balance to adequate for large and long on the lighter weights. Central states breaking stock prices ranged unchanged with checks and undergrades unchanged. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate. Demand was mostly moderate. Schedules full time. Trade sentiment steady to fully steady.

NORTHEAST REGIONAL Prices were unchanged, however the larger sizes continued to trend higher. The market tone was fully steady on the heavier weight eggs, but steady on mediums. Demand was mostly moderate to fairly good, best where features were in progress. Large 18 count eggs were advertised for 79 cents. Supplies were about adequate to fully adequate, with the larger sizes in the closest position. Breaking stock demand was light to moderate for adequate to ample offerings. Spent hens were sufficient to ample for trade requirements.

WEEKLY FRYERS AVAILABLE FOR MARKETING Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for marketing during the week ending 23-Jul-05 is estimated at 163.0 million head. This compares to 162.7 million head the previous week and to 167.1 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 163.2 million head and the composite weighted average price was 80.16 cents per pound.






New York Large Weekly Average Price
