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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to the previous day. The market tone was steady to barely steady on the larger sizes and steady to fully steady on medium. Demand at retail centers was moderate to fairly good. Supplies of mediums were adequate to at times close while the larger sizes were adequate to available. Breaking stock offerings were tight to barely sufficient for the moderate to good demand. Light type hens were mostly adequate for the fair to good demand.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were 2 cents lower for large and unchanged for the balance. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged but were trending lower for the larger sizes and higher for mediums for next week. Trade sentiment was steady to barely steady for the larger sizes and steady to fully steady for mediums. Retail demand was moderate to fairly good, best for feature activity. Food service was light to usually moderate. Supplies were adequate to at times close for medium and fully adequate to at times available for the larger sizes.

Trade sentiment was in a full range of cautiously steady to firm for whole egg and steady for whites and yolk. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate for whole egg and adequate on the balance of liquid products. Demand was fair for whole egg and fairly good for whites and yolk. Some breakers in need of breaking stock were considering purchasing whole egg to suffice for limited incoming breaking stock. Central states breaking stock prices ranged 1 cent higher than last week's reported prices.

CHICKENS AND EGGS

June Egg Production Up 1 Percent

U.S. egg production totaled 7.34 billion during June 2005, up 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.25 billion table eggs, and 1.10 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.03 billion were broiler-type and 61 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during June 2005 averaged 341 million, down slightly from a year earlier. June egg production per 100 layers was 2,151 eggs, up 1 percent from June 2004.

All layers in the U.S. on July 1, 2005, totaled 340 million, down 1 percent from a year ago. The 340 million layers consisted of 281 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 56.0 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.59 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on July 1, 2005, averaged 72.3 eggs per 100 layers, up 1 percent from a year ago.
