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## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to the previous day. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak entering the weekend. Retail and distributive demand was light to moderate. Supplies were reported as mostly ample for the heavier weight eggs and sufficient to available on the balance of sizes. Breaking stock offerings were fully adequate to ample for the light to moderate demand. Spent hens were mostly adequate to at least adequate for the fair to moderate demand. Processing schedules were reported as normal for the upcoming week.

Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. Retail and food service demand were reported as light to moderate with planned retail features for next week providing the best movement. Supplies were ample for the larger sizes and adequate to available for the balance.

**CENTRAL REGION FROZEN** Frozen whole egg ranged unchanged to 1 cent lower with whites unchanged. Sugared yolk ranged unchanged to 4 cents lower with salted yolk ranging 1 cent lower. Trade sentiment was steady to instances barely steady for whole egg and steady on the balance. Most processors were unwilling to adjust frozen prices due to increases in transportation and packaging costs. Offerings were balanced to adequate while demand continued light to moderate. Floor stocks were reported as closely balanced to adequate. Central states breaking stock prices were lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

**EASTERN REGION FROZEN** Majority prices were unchanged to higher on whites, unchanged on whole, but lower on yolks when compared to a week earlier. Demand was fair, but unaggressive as traders watch further market developments. Offerings were sufficient for trade needs. Trade sentiment remained mixed as packers were showing increase costs for energy and ingredients. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 01-Oct-2005 were 3% more than the previous week, and 6% higher than a year earlier.

**NATIONAL DRIED** Mostly prices were unchanged on albumen and whole, unchanged to lower on blends, and irregular on yolks when compared to a week earlier. Trading was very light on yolks and only fair on other items. Offerings were sufficient, but not freely available. Trade sentiment was unsettled to steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 01-Oct-2005 were 11% more than the previous week, and 44% higher than a year earlier. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced were up 7% over a year ago.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized salt yolk reported at 60 to 61 cents fob with pasteurized whites too few to report. Trade sentiment was weak for whole egg and barely steady to weak on the balance of liquid products. Offerings were fully adequate to ample for whole egg and fully adequate for whites and yolk. Demand was slow and disappointing for whole egg and mostly light on the remainder of liquid products. Many breakers were reporting difficulty in securing tankers for immediate shipment of liquid products. Central States breaking stock prices were lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

**EGG PRODUCTS****Shell Eggs Broken Up 7 Percent**

Shell eggs broken totaled 181 million dozen during August 2005, up 7 percent from August a year ago and 7 percent above the 168 million broken last month.

August 2005 contained 23 weekdays and four Saturdays. August 2004 contained 22 weekdays and four Saturdays.

During calendar year 2005 through August, shell eggs broken totaled 1.37 billion dozen, up 8 percent from the 1.27 million dozen broken in the comparable period in 2004. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2005 was 1.77 billion pounds, up 8 percent from 2004.
