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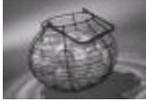

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices ended the week unchanged on all sizes. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady entering the weekend. Demand was in a full range of light to good with best movement centered around feature activity. Supplies were adequate to instances ample for present trade needs. Breaking stock offerings ranged sufficient to ample for the light to moderate demand. Schedules were noted as generally normal. Spent hens were at least adequate to ample for the light to moderate demand. Processing schedules were reported as mostly normal for the upcoming week.

CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Frozen whole egg and salted yolk ranged unchanged to 1 cent lower with frozen whites unchanged and sugared yolk 1 cent lower. Trade sentiment was steady for whole egg and whites and about steady to barely steady for frozen yolk products. Offerings were adequate to available and generally made to order with demand mostly light to instances moderate. Breaking stock prices were unchanged when compared to last week's reported prices.

Demand and trading was light to fair with offerings at least sufficient for current needs. Trade sentiment was cautious, but usually reported as steady. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 06-May-2006 were 3 % more than the previous week, and unchanged when compared to a year ago.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices were unchanged to higher on whole, and unchanged to lower on the balance of items when compared to a week earlier. Demand was light on yolks, but at least moderate on other items. Overall, offerings were tight on albumen, about adequate to adequate on whole, and irregular but usually fully sufficient on yolks. Trade sentiment was full steady on albumen, steady on whole, and no better than steady on yolks. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 06-May-2006 were 6 % more than the previous week, and 9 % higher than last year. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced were 4 % above a year earlier.

Demand was good for whole egg and whites and light for yolk. Offerings were fully adequate for whole egg, adequate to tight for whites, and adequate for current needs for yolk. Shell Eggs Broken Down 5 Percent
Shell eggs broken totaled 170 million dozen during March 2006, down 5 percent from March a year ago, but 7 percent above the 159 million broken last month.

March 2006 contained 23 weekdays and four Saturdays, the same as March 2005.

During calendar year 2006 through March, shell eggs broken totaled 495 million dozen, up slightly from the comparable period in 2005. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2006 was 645 million pounds, virtually unchanged from 2005.
