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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were 1 cent higher on all sizes when compared to Thursday's values. The market tone was fully steady to firm entering the weekend. Demand was light to very good, usually moderate. Supplies were balanced to at times available. Breaking stock offerings were tight to adequate for a light to moderate demand. Light type fowl were fully sufficient to ample for the light to moderate demand.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were higher for all sizes. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged with asking prices for next week's delivery trending higher. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. Retail was somewhat mixed ranging moderate to at times very good, but usually moderate to good where feature activity was a driving factor. Loose egg demand was light to mostly moderate as resort and vacation areas begin to show signs of activity. Supplies were in balance to adequate and continued to be held with increased confidence in higher prices coming next week.

Demand and trading was light to fair with offerings generally sufficient for current needs. Trade sentiment was mixed and unsettled on yolks, steady on whole, and at least steady on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 13-May-2006 were 1% more than the previous week, and unchanged when compared to a year ago.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices were unchanged to higher on albumen, unchanged on blends, but unchanged to lower on balance of items when compared to a week earlier. Demand was light on yolks, and moderate to light on other items. Offerings were not all that available on albumen, close balance to adequate on whole, and sufficient on yolks. Trade sentiment was steady to full steady on albumen, improving on whole and was generally steady, and usually no better than steady on yolks. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 13-May-2006 were 12% more than the previous week, and 19% higher than last year. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced were 5 % above a year earlier.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 26 to 31 cents fob with no pasteurized whites reported. Trade sentiment was steady for whole egg and whites and steady to barely steady for yolk. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate for whole egg, tight to barely adequate for whites, and usually adequate for yolk. Demand was fairly good for whole egg and whites, and fair for yolk. Spot demand was reported as improving on whites and yolk with most buyers still attempting to negotiate at current price levels. Central States breaking stock prices were unchanged when compared to the past week's reported prices.
