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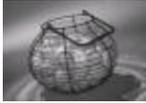

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to Thursday's values. Trade sentiment ranged steady to at times weak entering the weekend. Demand into all channels ranged light to moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to ample for immediate trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient to fully sufficient for the light to moderate demand. Schedules were reported as mostly normal. Spent hens were adequate to ample for the light to fair at best demand. Slaughter schedules were noted as mostly normal for the upcoming week.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were sharply lower for large and medium and unchanged for small. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged with asking prices on shell eggs for next week's delivery trending sharply lower on all sizes. Trade sentiment was steady to barely steady. Cartoned egg sales were light to moderate, best for retail feature activity. Loose egg demand was light to instances moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to ample.

Central states breaking stock prices were lower. Demand was light for the adequate offerings. Most breakers worked from current supplies and were not purchasing any additional product unless it was necessary to do so. Trade sentiment barely steady to weak.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices trended higher on albumen, unchanged to higher on blends, but lower on balance of items when compared to a week earlier. Trading was fair. Demand was improving on yolks, was fair on whole eggs, and reported as moderate to good on albumen. Offerings of albumen were limited, other items were irregular but usually sufficient for current trade interest. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 10-Jun-2006 were 23% more than the previous week, but 28% less than a year ago. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced were 2% higher than a year earlier.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 36 to 43 cents fob with no pasteurized whites reported. Trade sentiment was steady to barely steady for whole egg and steady to about steady for the balance of liquid products. Demand was fairly good to good for whole egg and yolk and fair for whites in most locations. Offerings were adequate to available for all products. Many liquid buyers had backed away from current spot trading and were waiting for liquid markets to bottom.
