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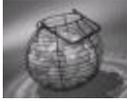

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged on all sizes when compared to Thursday's values. The market tone was mostly fully steady to firm entering the weekend. Retail and distributive demand was moderate to good. Supplies were adequate to tight for the larger sizes while the lighter weight eggs ranged adequate to fully adequate. Breaking stock offerings were about adequate to sporadically available for the light to moderate demand. Schedules were reported as mixed. Spent hen supplies were at least adequate to available for the fair to moderate demand. Processing schedules were noted as normal for the upcoming week.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices to producers were higher for large and small with the balance of prices unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to firm, mostly fully steady to firm. Retail sales were moderate to good while loose egg demand ranged light to very good. Supplies were tight to adequate for the larger sizes and adequate to fully adequate for the lighter weights.

Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 15-Jul-2006 were 19% more than the previous week, and 20% higher than a year ago; the total to date of liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) was about 3% less than the total a year earlier.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices were unchanged on blends and yolks, unchanged to slightly lower on albumen, but unchanged to higher on whole eggs when compared to a week earlier. Trading was light for immediate shipment, but fair for future deliveries. Offerings were in close balance to sufficient for immediate trade requirements. The undertone was steady to fully steady on whole, and at least steady on balance of items. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 15-Jul-2006 were 5% lower than the previous week, and 3% lower than a year ago. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced was 1% more than a year earlier.

Demand was fairly good to good for whole egg by the end of the week as buyers were attempting to buy ahead of potential market increases. White and yolk demand was light to moderate. CHICKENS AND EGGS**June Egg Production Up 1 Percent**

U.S. egg production totaled 7.38 billion during June 2006, up 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.33 billion table eggs, and 1.06 billion hatching eggs, of which 991 million were broiler-type and 66 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during June 2006 averaged 342 million, up 1 percent from last year. June egg production per 100 layers was 2,159 eggs, down slightly from June 2005.

All layers in the U.S. on July 1, 2006, totaled 341 million, up 1 percent from last year. The 341 million layers consisted of 284 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 54.0 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.82 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on July 1, 2006, averaged 72.7 eggs per 100 layers, up slightly from July 1, 2005.
