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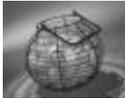
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## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to Thursday's values. Trade sentiment was mostly steady entering the weekend. Retail and distributive demand was light to moderate. Supplies were balanced to at times ample. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to fully sufficient for the light to moderate demand. Schedules were mostly normal to heavy. Spent hens were at least adequate to ample for a light to fair demand. Slaughter schedules were reported as usually normal.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized whites were too few to report with pasteurized salt yolk reported from 29 to 33 cents fob, mostly 29 cents fob. Trade sentiment was mostly steady to instances barely steady for whole egg at current trading levels. Whites were reported as steady to firm, mostly fully steady to firm with yolk steady. Demand was fair for whole egg, fairly good to good for whites, and light for yolk. Offerings were fully adequate for whole egg, adequate to tight for whites, and adequate to available for yolk. Animal Care Certified whites were reported as scarce with some additional bidding unable to secure additional product. Breaking stock prices were unchanged to 1 cent lower when compared to last week.

**CENTRAL REGION FROZEN** Frozen whole egg ranged 1 to 3 cents lower with whites unchanged. Sugared yolk ranged irregular with salted yolk 2 cents lower. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm for whites with the balance of frozen products carrying a steady to barely steady undertone. Demand was fair to fairly good for whites and mostly seasonally moderate on the remainder of frozen products although reported as very sporadic at times. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate with whole egg in the longest position. Breaking stock prices ranged unchanged to 1 cent lower from last week's reported prices.

Interest and trading was slightly improved but generally reported as fair. However, supplies remain adequate for trade needs. Undertone was steady, but cautious on most items. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 09-Sep-2006 were 6% less than the previous week, but 4% higher than a year ago; the total to date of liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) was about 3% less than the total a year earlier.
