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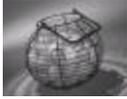

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged on all weights when compared to Thursday's values. The market tone was fully steady to firm entering the weekend. Demand was moderate to good. Supplies of larger sizes were barely sufficient to tight and mediums were generally adequate. Breaking stock offerings were limited to short for the moderate to good demand. Light type hens were adequate to fully adequate for the light to moderate demand. Processing schedules were reported as normal to reduced for next week.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were higher for large and unchanged for the balance. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged with asking prices for next week's delivery were trending sharply higher. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. Catoned egg sales remained fairly good to good. Loose egg movement was mostly moderate to at times fairly good. Supplies were barely adequate to tight for extra large and large and usually adequate for the balance.
