



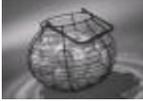
# USDA EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

In New York, prices were 3 cents higher on all sizes when compared to Wednesday's values. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm entering the holiday weekend. Retail and distributive demand was light to good. Supplies were adequate to close for current trade needs. Breaking stock demand was moderate to good for inadequate to close offerings. Schedules were reported as normal to reduced. Spent hens were mostly adequate to about adequate for the fair to moderate demand. Slaughter schedules were noted as mixed for the upcoming week.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized whites were too few to report with pasteurized salt yolk reported at 35 to 44 cents fob, mostly 43 to 44 cents fob. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady for whole egg and fully steady to firm on the balance of liquid products. Demand was moderate to good for whole egg, good to very good for whites, and fairly good to good for yolk. Offerings were adequate to available for whole egg, tight to mostly short of needs for whites, and usually adequate for yolk. Breaking stock prices were unchanged when compared to the previous week's reported prices.

**NATIONAL DRIED** Mostly prices were unchanged on yolks, unchanged to higher on whole and blends, and sharply higher on albumen when compared to a week earlier. Demand and trading ranged fair to light. Offerings were usually about adequate to adequate for trade needs. Trade sentiment was steady on yolks and blends, steady to fully steady on whole, and firm on albumen. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 04-Nov-2006 were 4% less than the previous week and 33% lower than a year ago. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced were 6% lower than a year earlier. The total monthly dried egg inventory was 13% less than the previous month, but 1% more than a year ago.

**EGG PRODUCTS****Shell Eggs Broken Down 6 Percent**

Shell eggs broken totaled 167 million dozen during September 2006, down 6 percent from September a year ago, and 8 percent below the 182 million broken last month.

September 2006 contained 21 weekdays (including one holiday) and 5 Saturdays. September 2005 contained 22 weekdays (including one holiday) and 4 Saturdays.

During calendar year 2006 through September, shell eggs broken totaled 1.53 billion dozen, down 1 percent from the comparable period in 2005. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2006 was 1.99 billion pounds, down 1 percent from 2005.
