





NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York prices were unchanged when compared to a day earlier. Demand was seasonal but in a range of fair to good, with best movement noted where specials were in progress. Supplies were usually balanced on mediums, but increasing in availability on larger weights. Traders were closely watch the winter storm and trying to access the affects that it may have on the markets. Overall, trade sentiment was about steady to steady on mediums, but unsettled to weak on larger sizes. Breaking stock demand was light to moderate. Offerings were in a full range of barely adequate to fully adequate. However, some current bids to buy were at lower trending levels. Light type hens were mostly adequate for a fair to moderate demand.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were 3 cents lower for large. All other reported prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to weak. Cartoned egg sales were light to moderate. Food service sales were light. Supplies were fully adequate to ample for the larger sizes and balanced for the lighter weights.

Light type hens were mostly adequate for the fair to moderate demand.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized whites and salted yolk were too few to report. Trade sentiment was barely steady to mostly weak for whole egg and whites and steady to about steady for yolk. Demand was fairly good to good for whole egg and whites, with discounts helping to stimulate movement. Yolk demand was reported as usually quiet with most yolk movement centering around previously negotiated product. Offerings were fully adequate to ample for whole egg and whites and tight to adequate for yolk. Breaking stock prices were lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

Trade sentiment was steady to cautiously steady at current reported prices for all frozen products. Offerings were closely balanced to adequate while demand was reported as fair for whole egg and whites and slow to instances good for frozen yolk products. Breaking stock prices were lower compared to last week's reported prices.

Offerings were about adequate and clearing. Trade sentiment was reported as steady on yolks; unsettled and mixed on both whole and albumen. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 25-Nov-2006 were unchanged from the previous week, but 6% lower than a year ago. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced were 6% lower than a year earlier.
