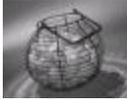

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices ended the week unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was usually steady entering the weekend. Demand was light to very good, best where promotions enhanced movement. Supplies were balanced to sufficient for lighter weights and adequate to fully adequate for larger sizes. Breaking stock offerings were tight to at times ample for a light to moderate demand. Spent fowl supplies were mostly sufficient for the fair to fairly good demand.

EASTERN REGION BREAKING STOCK Mostly prices were 4 to 5 cents lower when compared to early week trading. Trade sentiment was mixed but mostly weak to barely steady. Offerings were in a range of ample in some locations to about adequate in others. Floor stocks were reported as sufficient from regular suppliers and contract growers for normal to heavy breaking schedules. Demand was only fair to occasionally moderate. Cases broken under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 02-Dec-2006 were 10% more than the previous week, but 7% less than a year earlier.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized whites were too few to report with pasteurized yolk reported at 40 to 44 cents fob. Trade sentiment continued barely steady to mostly weak for whole egg, mostly steady for whites, and steady to about steady for yolk. Offerings were fully adequate to mostly ample for whole egg, tight to barely adequate for whites, and adequate for yolk. Demand was reported as seasonal for all liquid products with whole egg demand fair to good at discounted prices, good for whites, and light to fair for spot loads of yolk. Breaking stock prices were lower when compared to the previous week's reported prices.

CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Frozen whole egg ranged 1.5 to 2 cents lower with frozen whites and sugared yolk unchanged to 1 cent lower. Salted yolk ranged 1 to 2 cents lower. Trade sentiment was cautiously steady to barely steady for all frozen products as they are seen as adjusting downward, following their liquid counterparts. Spot demand was fair to fairly good and best for sugared and salted yolk. Offerings were usually adequate for the current interest. Breaking stock prices were lower when compared to the past week's reported prices.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices were unchanged on yolks and blends, but unchanged to lower on whole and albumen when compared to a week earlier. Demand was light. Offerings were clearing and in close balance for limited needs. Trade sentiment was reported as steady on yolks; and usually unsettled to about steady on whole and albumen. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 02-Dec-2006 were 19% higher than the previous week, but 6% lower than a year ago. The total year to date production on dried eggs produced were 6% lower than a year earlier.

EGG PRODUCTS**Shell Eggs Broken Down 4 Percent from Last Year**

Shell eggs broken totaled 169 million dozen during October 2006, down 4 percent from October a year ago, but 1 percent above the 167 million broken last month.

October 2006 contained 22 weekdays (including one holiday) and 4 Saturdays. October 2005 contained 21 weekdays (including one holiday) and 5 Saturdays.

During calendar year 2006 through October, shell eggs broken totaled 1.70 billion dozen, down 1 percent from the comparable period in 2005. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2006 was 2.21 billion pounds, down 1 percent from 2005.
