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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged on all sizes when compared to Thursday's values. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand was in a full range of slow to very good, mostly light to moderate. Supplies were closely balanced to adequate, at times short on larger sizes. Breaking stock offerings were short to barely sufficient for the fair to good demand. Light type hens were at least adequate to sufficient for a fair to moderate demand.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices on blends were irregular, yolks were unchanged to higher, and the balance of items were sharply higher when compared to a week earlier. Demand was fair to good. Offerings were sufficient to barely adequate for immediate needs. Trade sentiment was steady to full steady on yolks, other items remained generally on the firm side. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 20-Jan-2007 were 21% less than the previous week, and 34% lower than a year ago. The total year to date production of dried eggs produced were 16% lower than a year earlier.

CHICKENS AND EGGS**December Egg Production Down Slightly**

U.S. egg production totaled 7.78 billion during December 2006, down slightly from last year. Production included 6.68 billion table eggs, and 1.09 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.03 billion were broiler-type and 66 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during December 2006 averaged 348 million, down slightly from last year. December egg production per 100 layers was 2,234 eggs, down slightly from December 2005.

All layers in the U.S. on January 1, 2007 totaled 348 million, down slightly from last year. The 348 million layers consisted of 290 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 55.1 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.86 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on January 1, 2007, averaged 71.1 eggs per 100 layers, down 1 percent from January 1, 2006.
