Trade sentiment was fully steady to occasionally firm. Offerings were limited and usually from regular commitments. Demand was moderate but some what unaggressive. Breaking schedules were reported as mostly normal. Cases broken under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 17-Feb-2007 were 3% less than last week, and 11% lower than a year ago.
