## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices remained unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was steady to at times fully steady. Demand was light to instances fairly good, mostly light to moderate. In the Midwest, a severe winter storm delayed deliveries throughout the region. Supplies were tight to fully sufficient. Breaking stock offerings were limited to adequate for a light to moderate demand. Spent hens were about adequate to sufficient for the fair to fairly good demand.

Several reports of delivery delays of up to one to two days have been reported due to a severe winter storm over the last 24 hours that affected a large portion of the Midwest. Supplies were balanced to fully adequate.

**EASTERN REGION BREAKING STOCK** Mostly prices were unchanged on nest run breaking stock, but slightly higher on checks and undergrades when compared to early week trading. Supplies were about adequate for trade needs, although offerings were limited and usually from regular suppliers. Demand was light to moderate with most buyers unaggressive. However, trade sentiment was fully steady as late week trading was more toward the high side of the majority. Breaking schedules were reported as about normal. Cases broken under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 24-Feb-2007 were 9% more than the previous week, but 2% less than a year ago.

Offerings were tight to adequate for whole egg and whites and about adequate for yolk. Breaking stock prices ranged unchanged when compared to the past week's reported prices.

Buyers were getting into a seasonal pattern but interest was still moderate. Offerings were limited and in a range of about adequate to adequate for trade inquiry. The undertone was steady to full steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 24-Feb-2007 were 6% more than the previous week, but 9% lower than a year ago. The total year to date production of dried eggs produced were 22% lower than a year earlier.

**CHICKENS AND EGGS****January Egg Production Down 1 Percent**

U.S. egg production totaled 7.64 billion during January 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.54 billion table eggs, and 1.10 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.03 billion were broiler-type and 67 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during January 2007 averaged 347 million, down 1 percent from last year. January egg production per 100 layers was 2,200 eggs, down slightly from January 2006.

All layers in the U.S. on February 1, 2007 totaled 347 million, down 1 percent from last year. The 347 million layers consisted of 288 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 55.7 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.81 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on February 1, 2007, averaged 70.7 eggs per 100 layers, down slightly from February 1, 2006.
