NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York prices were unchanged when compared to a day earlier. Demand was seasonal but in a range of light to moderate, with best movement noted where very limited promotions were in progress. Supplies were usually in balanced, but increasing in availability. Buyers were closely watch further market developments, even though most traders were viewing markets as steady. Breaking stock demand was light to moderate. Floor stock were barely adequate. However, current trading was steady but at the high side of market levels. Light type hens were about adequate to adequate for a fair to moderate demand.

The undertone was fully steady as trading values continue to trend to the high side of the majority. Breaking schedules were reported as about normal. Cases broken under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 03-Mar-2007 were 12% more than the previous week, and a year ago. The total cases broken under federal inspection were 6% less than a year earlier.

Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 03-Mar-2007 were 18% more than the previous week, and 20% higher than a year ago.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG REPORT Mostly prices were unchanged to slightly lower on yolks, unchanged on whole, unchanged to higher on blends, and higher on albumen when compared to a week earlier. Demand was only fair with buyers purchasing on as needed basis. Offerings were limited and in a range of about adequate to adequate for trade inquiry. The undertone was usually steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 03-Mar-2007 were 23% less than the previous week, and 18% lower than a year ago. The total year to date production of dried eggs produced were 22% lower than a year earlier.
