In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to the previous day. Trade sentiment was mostly firm. Demand continued light to usually moderate. Supplies were adequate to close, instances tight in some areas. Breaking stock offerings were short to barely sufficient for the fair to very good demand. Light type hens were adequate to fully sufficient for the moderate demand.

The undertone was fully steady to firm. Total cases broken under federal inspection from January through the week ending 21-Apr-2007 were 3% less than a year earlier. In the Eastern region total cases broken during the week of 21-Apr-2007 were 2% less than the previous week and 5% lower than a year ago.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized whites were too few to report with pasteurized salted yolk reported in a range of 53 to 72 cents fob. Trade sentiment continued firm for all liquid products. Demand was very good for whole egg and good to very good on the balance of liquid products. Offerings were short to unavailable for whole egg while increased bids did little to satisfy current whole egg demand. White and yolk offerings were tight. Breaking stock prices were higher when compared to the previous week's reported prices.

Trade sentiment was firm for all frozen products. Demand was moderate to fairly good with yolk products showing the strongest spot movement. Offerings were closely balanced to just adequate in most locations. Breaking stock prices were higher when compared to last week's reported prices.

Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 21-Apr-2007 was 6% less than the previous week, and 21% lower than a year ago. The total year to date of dried eggs produced was 16% less than a year earlier.

CHICKENS AND EGGS**March Egg Production Down 1 Percent**

U.S. egg production totaled 7.77 billion during March 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.65 billion table eggs, and 1.12 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.06 billion were broiler-type and 68 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during March 2007 averaged 346 million, down 1 percent from last year. March egg production per 100 layers was 2,243 eggs, up slightly from March 2006.

All layers in the U.S. on April 1, 2007 totaled 346 million, down 1 percent from last year. The 346 million layers consisted of 286 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 56.3 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.80 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on April 1, 2007, averaged 73.0 eggs per 100 layers, up slightly from April 1, 2006.
