NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Prices in New York were unchanged on all sizes when compared to a day earlier. Demand was light to moderate, but not up to holiday expectations. Supplies ranged from adequate to ample for trade needs. Overall, traders continue to watch further market developments very closely. Breaker demand was light to occasionally fairly good, but had slowed in late week trading. Floor stocks were adequate to ample for seasonal but usually normal processing schedules.

Total cases broken under federal inspection from January through the week ending 19-May-2007 was 4% less than a year ago. Offerings were fully adequate for whole egg, fully adequate to ample for whites, and closely balanced to tight for yolk. Demand was light to fairly good for whole egg and good on the balance of liquid products. Breaking stock prices were lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices were unchanged on albumen, but unchanged to slightly lower on whole and yolks when compared to a week earlier. Inquiry was about moderate as several buyers were still only purchasing product for immediate needs. Offerings were limited and reported as about adequate to occasionally short of trade inquiry. The undertone was usually steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 19-May-2007 were 12% more than the previous week, but 26% lower than a year ago. The total year to date of dried eggs processed was 20% less than a year earlier.

CHICKENS AND EGGS**April Egg Production Down 1 Percent**

U.S. egg production totaled 7.43 billion during April 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.34 billion table eggs, and 1.09 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.03 billion were broiler-type and 66 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during April 2007 averaged 344 million, down 1 percent from last year. April egg production per 100 layers was 2,162 eggs, down slightly from April 2006.

All layers in the U.S. on May 1, 2007 totaled 342 million, down 1 percent from last year. The 342 million layers consisted of 283 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 56.5 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.87 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on May 1, 2007, averaged 71.1 eggs per 100 layers, down slightly from May 1, 2006.
