In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to the previous day's values. The market tone was steady to fully steady entering the weekend. Demand was moderate to good. Supplies were balanced to fully adequate for current needs. Breaking stock offerings were tight to sufficient for the fair to good demand. Light type hens were mostly adequate for the fair to moderate demand.

Trade sentiment was fully steady with a firm undertone. Cartoned and loose egg demand was moderate to at times good. Supplies were in close balance to adequate and were held with confidence. Central states breaking stock prices were higher. Demand was fair to fairly good. Offerings were tight and held with confidence. Floor stocks were adequate to fully adequate. Schedules were full-time. Trade sentiment fully steady to instances firm.

Demand and trading was light to moderate. Supplies were usually sufficient for trade needs. Undertone was steady on yolks, other items were mixed to about steady. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 09-Jun-2007 were 14% more than the previous week, and 1% higher than a year ago.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG REPORT Mostly prices were unchanged on yolks, unchanged to lower on whole, and lower on albumen when compared to a week earlier. Interest was moderately active. However, current movement was still somewhat slow. Supplies were reported as in very close balance to occasionally adequate for trade inquiry. The undertone was steady on yolks, barely steady on whole, and unsettled and mixed on albumen. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 09-Jun-2007 were 9% more than the previous week, and 11% higher than a year ago. The total production year to date of dried eggs processed were 16% less than a year earlier.

EGG PRODUCTS

Shell Eggs Broken Down 4 Percent from Last Year

Shell eggs broken totaled 156 million dozen during April 2007, down 4 percent from April a year ago, and 7 percent below the 168 million broken last month.

April 2007 contained 21 weekdays and 4 Saturdays. April 2006 contained 20 weekdays and 5 Saturdays.

During calendar year 2007 through April, shell eggs broken totaled 634 million dozen, down 4 percent from the comparable period in 2006. To date, cumulative total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2007 was 832 million pounds, down 3 percent from 2006.
