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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

In New York, prices were unchanged. Elsewhere, regional prices were higher on larger sizes and unchanged on mediums. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand into all channels was light to good. Supplies were closely balanced to fully adequate. Breaking stock offerings were tight to fully sufficient for a moderate to good demand. Light type hens were usually adequate for the fair to moderate demand.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Midwest delivered prices were higher for the larger sizes and unchanged for mediums. Other reported prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was fully steady. Cartoned and loose egg demand was moderate to at times good. Supplies were adequate to close and held with confidence. Central states breaking stock prices were unchanged to higher with checks and undergrades unchanged. Demand was moderate to good for the tight to adequate offerings. Floor stocks were adequate. Schedules were full-time. Trade sentiment steady with a firm undertone.

Offerings were adequate to available with demand light to instances fairly good.

CALIFORNIA Benchmark prices increased 3 cents on jumbo's, 5 cents on extra large, 4 cents on large, and was unchanged on mediums and smalls. The Pacific inventory was unchanged from last Monday, with California down 3% and OR-WA-UT increasing by 4%. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. Retailer demand was moderate to instances fairly good. Offerings were adequate to close and confidently held. Small benchmark price 69 cents.
