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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

In New York, prices ended the week unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was steady, however some caution was noted. Demand into all channels continued light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to ample for current trade requirements. Breaking stock offerings were short to sufficient for the fair to good demand. Light type fowl were mostly adequate for the fair to moderate demand. Slaughter schedules were reported as normal to instances heavy.

CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Frozen whole egg ranged irregular with whites unchanged to 1 cent higher. Sugared yolk ranged 2 cents higher with salted yolk 2 to 3 cents higher. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm for whole egg, steady to fully steady for whites, and firm for yolk. Offerings were balanced to adequate and usually made to order. Demand was light to fairly good for all frozen products with yolk showing the most interest. Breaking stock prices were higher when compared to last week's reported prices.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN Mostly prices were unchanged on whites, unchanged to slightly higher on whole eggs, but higher on yolks when compared to a week earlier. Demand and trading was fair to moderate. Floor stocks were reported as in close balance to about adequate for trade needs. Undertone was steady but somewhat improving on whites, and fully steady to firm on other items. Over all yolks continue to be in the best position. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 21-Jul-2007 were 1% more than the previous week, but 12% less than a year ago.

NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices were unchanged on albumen and blends, but higher on whole and yolks when compared to a week earlier. Demand was irregular but generally fair to good. Supplies were reported as short to barely adequate for trade needs. The undertone continued to improving on albumen, with a fully steady to firm tone on whole and yolks. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 21-Jul-2007 were 5% less than the previous week, and 16% lower than a year ago. The total production year to date of dried eggs processed was 15% below a year earlier.

CHICKENS AND EGGS

June Egg Production Down 1 Percent

U.S. egg production totaled 7.36 billion during June 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.24 billion table eggs, and 1.12 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.05 billion were broiler-type and 65 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during June 2007 averaged 339 million, down 1 percent from last year. June egg production per 100 layers was 2,169 eggs, up slightly from June 2006.

All layers in the U.S. on July 1, 2007 totaled 339 million, down 1 percent from last year. The 339 million layers consisted of 279 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 57.0 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.75 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on July 1, 2007, averaged 72.0 eggs per 100 layers, down 1 percent from July 1, 2006.
