



EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to a day earlier. Trade sentiment was steady with some caution developing. Supplies were in close balanced to occasionally available. Overall, floor stocks were reported as sufficient to fully adequate for trade needs. Demand was light to mostly moderate. However, feature activity was higher than the previous week, but lower than a year ago. The averaged featured price was also lower than a week earlier. "No Price" ads were heavy in the SW and NW. Specialty shell eggs features were also higher than last week or last year. Breaking stock supplies were short to sufficient; and any additional offerings were usually held with confidence. Light type hens were mostly adequate for the fair to moderate demand.
