NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged on all sizes when compared to Thursday's values. The market tone was steady on mediums and about steady to at times barely steady on the larger sizes. Demand at retail outlets was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available for the heavy weighted eggs and sufficient to balanced for mediums. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to instances ample for the light to fairly good demand. Light type hens were adequate to fully sufficient for the moderate demand. Slaughter schedules were reported as normal to occasionally heavy.

Retail demand light to mostly moderate and showing improvement. Food service movement moderate. Supplies fully adequate to available for the larger sizes and adequate to balanced for medium and small. Central states breaking stock prices unchanged. Offerings fully adequate to instances ample for the light to fairly good demand. Floor stocks fully adequate to ample. Schedules full-time to over-time. Trade sentiment steady to barely steady.

Demand was good to instances very good for all products with yolk and whole egg receiving the most attention. Breaking stock prices were unchanged to 1 cent higher when compared to the previous week's reported prices.

Offerings were tight to closely balanced for whole egg and yolk with whites adequate. Demand was fair to fairly good and best for sugared yolk. Breaking stock prices were unchanged to 1 cent higher when compared to the past week's reported prices.

Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 06-Oct-2007 were 1% less than the previous week, but 1% more than a year ago.

NATIONAL DRIED Prices generally trended higher on whole, irregular but usually unchanged to slightly higher on yolks, and mostly unchanged on albumen when compared to a week earlier. Demand was fair on new business, although movement was reported as moderate to good. Supplies were in close balance to about adequate for current trade needs with dried inventories continuing to decline. Trade sentiment was at least steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 06-Oct-2007 were 4% less than the previous week, but 20% more than a year ago. The total production year to date, of dried eggs processed was 13% less than last year.

EGG PRODUCTS

Shell Eggs Broken Up 1 Percent from Last Year

Shell eggs broken totaled 185 million dozen during August 2007, up 1 percent from August a year ago, and 11 percent above the 166 million broken last month.

August 2007 contained 23 weekdays and 4 Saturdays. August 2006 contained 23 weekdays and 4 Saturdays.

During calendar year 2007 through August, shell eggs broken totaled 1.33 billion dozen, down 2 percent from the comparable period in 2006. To date, cumulative total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2007 was 1.74 billion pounds, down 2 percent from 2006.
