## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to the previous day's values. The market tone was steady to fully steady, occasionally firm entering the weekend. Retail and distributive demand was light to good. Supplies were adequate to tight for the larger sizes and sufficient to short for the lighter weights. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to short for the moderate to good demand. Light type fowl were generally adequate for the at least moderate demand.

Central states breaking stock prices were higher. Offerings were tight to inadequate of needs with demand fairly good to good. Floor stocks were balanced to tight. Schedules were mostly full-time for next week. Trade sentiment fully steady to mostly firm.

Offerings were adequate for whites and closely balanced to tight for the remainder of products. Demand was moderate to fairly good for all products with reports that salted yolk demand was beginning to lighten. Breaking stock prices were higher when compared to last week's reported prices.

Supplies were in close balance to about adequate for current trade needs. Trade sentiment was usually steady to full steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 20-Oct-2007 were 3% less than the previous week, but 41% more than a year ago. The total production year to date, of dried eggs processed was 12% less than last year.

**CHICKENS AND EGGS****September Egg Production Down 1 Percent**

U.S. egg production totaled 7.37 billion during September 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.27 billion table eggs, and 1.10 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.03 billion were broiler-type and 64 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during September 2007 averaged 340 million, down 1 percent from last year. September egg production per 100 layers was 2,169 eggs, up slightly from September 2006.

All layers in the U.S. on October 1, 2007 totaled 340 million, down 1 percent from last year. The 340 million layers consisted of 281 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 56.2 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.76 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on October 1, 2007, averaged 72.7 eggs per 100 layers, up 2 percent from October 1, 2006.
