Supplies were barely adequate to tight for present trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were barely sufficient to short for the moderate to at times very good demand. Light type fowl were barely adequate to sufficient for the moderate demand.

CENTRAL REGION Frozen whole egg prices ranged 6 to 7 cents higher with whites unchanged to 2 cents higher. Sugared yolk ranged 4 to 12 cents higher with salted yolk increasing 4 to 7 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady to instances fully steady for whites with the balance of products firm. Offerings were tight to barely adequate for all frozen products with the exception of whites which were adequate. Demand was best for whole egg and yolk products and rated as fairly good to good with demand for whites fair. Breaking stock prices were higher when compared to the previous week's reported prices.

NATIONAL DRIED Majority prices were unchanged on albumen, other items were all sharply higher when compared to a week earlier. Demand was good, but new sales was at best only fair. Offerings were in close balance to short of trade needs. Trade sentiment was at least fully steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 10-Nov-2007 were 4% less than the previous week, but 4% more than a year ago. The total production year to date, of dried eggs processed was 9% less than last year.
