**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized whites and salted yolk were too few to report. Trade sentiment was steady for all products. **NATIONAL DRIED EGG REPORT** Mostly prices were unchanged to higher on whole and blends, but higher on yolks and albumen when compared to a week earlier. Product for immediate movement was often short of trade needs. Demand was good into the first quarter. Trade sentiment continues to be fully steady to firm. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 08-Dec-2007 were 26% less than the previous week, and 9% lower than a year ago. However, the total production year to date, of dried eggs processed was 8% less than last year.
