NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

In New York, prices were unchanged when compared to a day earlier. The market tone was generally steady going into the holiday weekend. Demand into retail outlets tempered in late week trading, but was still moderate to good. Overall, retail features were usually limited for this week's store adds. Early orders, in a few locations, for next week's deliveries were down slightly from current week fairly active movement. Floor stocks depending upon the region were usually in close balance to sufficient for immediate trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were barely sufficient for a moderate to fairly good demand. Light type fowl offerings were generally sufficient for the moderate demand.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady. Retail demand was moderate to good, best for last minute holiday orders. Loose egg demand was light to moderate. Supplies were barely adequate to instances close for all sizes. Central states breaking stock prices were unchanged. Offerings were mostly tight to adequate the mostly moderate demand. Floor stocks in close balance to tight. Schedules full-time. Trade sentiment steady.

Eastern region breaking stock demand was fairly good with offerings in close balance for immediate requirements. Light type hens were generally adequate for a moderate demand.

EASTERN REGION BREAKING STOCK Prices were unchanged when compared to early week trading. The undertone was steady with traders still watching further markets developments. Demand was good, but not aggressive. Floor stocks were reported as in close balance for trade needs. Late week processing schedules were normal to less than normal, next week reduced for the holiday. Total cases broken under federal inspection from January through the week ending 15-Dec-2007 were 1% less than a year earlier. In the Eastern region total cases broken during the week of 15-Dec-2007 were 3% less than the previous week, but 13% more than last year.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized whites and salted yolk were too few to report. Trade sentiment continued mostly steady for all products. Offerings were adequate to available for whole egg and tight on the balance of products. Demand was light to moderate for whole egg due to the upcoming holiday. Demand for whites was light with yolk demand fairly good. Breaking stock prices ranged unchanged to lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN Mostly prices were unchanged on salt yolks, balanced was generally unchanged to lower when compared to a week earlier. However, the undertone was still fully steady to firm. Demand was moderate for the available offerings. Overall, floor stocks remain limited to short on yolks, adequate to barely adequate on whole, and usually about adequate on whites. Breaking schedules in late week were normal to less than normal; next week reduced for the holiday. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 15-Dec-2007 were 3% more than the previous week, and 12% higher than last year.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG REPORT Mostly prices were irregular on albumen, with balance of other items mostly higher when compared to a week earlier. Product for immediate and early next quarter was often short of trade needs. Demand was good. Trade sentiment continues to be fully steady to firm. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 15-Dec-2007 were 7% more than the previous week, but 10% lower than a year ago. However, the total production year to date, of dried eggs processed was 8% less than last year.

CHICKENS AND EGGS**November Egg Production Down 1 Percent**

U.S. egg production totaled 7.51 billion during November 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.42 billion table eggs, and 1.09 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.02 billion were broiler-type and 66 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during November 2007 averaged 343 million, down 1 percent from last year. November egg production per 100 layers was 2,190 eggs, up 1 percent from November 2006.

All layers in the U.S. on December 1, 2007 totaled 343 million, down 2 percent from last year. The 343 million layers consisted of 284 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 56.0 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.83 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on December 1, 2007, averaged 73.1 eggs per 100 layers, up slightly from December 1, 2006.
