## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices unchanged in New York when compared to the previous day's values. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending sharply lower in all regions. Trade sentiment was cautiously steady to weak. Demand ranged light to fairly good, better in the Northeast region where holiday buying was a factor. Supplies were adequate to ample for current needs. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient to ample for normal to over-time processing schedules. Light type hen offerings were at least adequate to ample for a moderate to good demand.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized whites were too few to report with pasteurized salt yolk reported from 129 to 135 fob. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak for whole egg, cautiously steady for whites, and steady for yolk. Offerings were fully adequate to ample for whole egg, adequate to fully adequate for whites, and balanced for yolk. Demand was light to moderate for whole egg and whites and light for yolk. Most buyers were waiting for current liquid markets to settle before buying additional product. Breaking stock prices were sharply lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

**NATIONAL DRIED** Prices were unchanged to slightly lower on albumen, lower on whole, yolks and blends when compared to the previous week. Offerings were sufficient. Demand was light to fair with buyers purchasing product on an as needed basis and watching further market developments. Trade sentiment was at best steady to albumen, barely steady on balance of products. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 05-Apr-2008 were 3% more than the previous week and 19% higher than a year ago. The total year to date production of dried eggs produced was 6% more than a year earlier.
