NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices were unchanged in all locations when compared to yesterday's values. Trade sentiment was steady to barely steady, however some caution was noted. Demand was light to at times fairly good entering the weekend. Supplies were adequate to available for current buyer and seller requirements. Breaking stock demand was light to moderate for fully adequate to ample offerings. Light type hens were at least adequate to ample for normal processing schedules.

Cartoned egg sales ranged from light to fairly good where features were a driving factor. Loose egg movement was usually light to attimes moderate. Supplies were adequate to available. Central states breaking stock prices were unchanged. Offerings were fully adequate to ample for the light to moderate demand. Floor stocks adequate to fully adequate. NATIONAL DRIED Mostly prices were lower on albumen, unchanged to lower on whole and yolks when compared to the previous week's values. Offerings were sufficient for a fair and unaggressive demand. Trade sentiment was at best steady to barely steady on yolks, unsettled on the balance. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 03-May-2008 were 2% less than the previous week, but 52% higher than a year ago. The total year to date production of dried eggs produced was 14% more than a year earlier.
