NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Regional shell egg prices were sharply higher when compared to the previous week's values. New York prices remained the same as last Friday. Trade sentiment was occasionally steady to firm. Demand into all channels ranged light to very good, mostly viewed as moderate to good. Supplies were adequate to tight for immediate trade needs. Breaking stock floor stocks were sufficient for normal to overtime schedules. Light type hen offerings were adequate to ample for a moderate demand.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Midwest delivered prices were sharply higher for all sizes. Producer prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. Cartoned egg demand continued to range from light to very good, usually moderate to fairly good. Food service movement was moderate. Supplies were adequate to tight. All central states breaking stock prices were higher. Offerings were tight for the fairly good to good demand. Floor stocks were closely balanced to adequate. Schedules full-time. Trade sentiment was firm.
