



NATIONAL EGG REVIEW



Prices increased in New York this period. All other reported regional prices were up sharply on the larger sizes and higher on mediums. The trade sentiment in New York was at least steady to steady on mediums and firm on the larger sizes. In other regions the trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. Retail demand was moderate to good, instances very good. Food service movement was usually moderate. Supplies were adequate to tight, with the larger sizes being in the closest position. Breaking stock prices, along with checks and undergrades, were higher. Demand was good with offerings short of current needs. Schedules were generally full-time. The trade sentiment was firm. North Central regional light hen removal costs were unchanged. Demand was moderate. Offerings were adequate to ample. Processing schedules were full-time to over-time. The trade sentiment continued steady.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Producer prices were 3 cents higher for large and unchanged for the balance. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged with asking prices for next week trending higher for the larger sizes. Trade sentiment was steady to firm. Cartoned egg demand was moderate to a times very good. Food service movement was usually moderate. Supplies were adequate to tight with the larger sizes in the closest position. Central states breaking stock prices were higher. Offerings were short the good demand. Floor stock were adequate to tight. Schedules generally full-time. Trade sentiment firm.

NORTHEAST REGIONAL Prices were unchanged, however larger sizes were trending sharply higher. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. Retail and distributive demand ranged moderate to good. Supplies were closely balanced to tight for current buyer and seller needs. Eastern region breaking stock demand was moderate to good for short offerings. Light hen offerings were adequate for normal processing schedules.

WEEKLY FRYERS AVAILABLE FOR MARKETING

Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for marketing during the week ending 19-Jul-08 is estimated at 163.9 million head. This compares to 162.1 million head the previous week and to 170.8 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 167.8 million head and the composite weighted average price was 81.24 cents per pound.

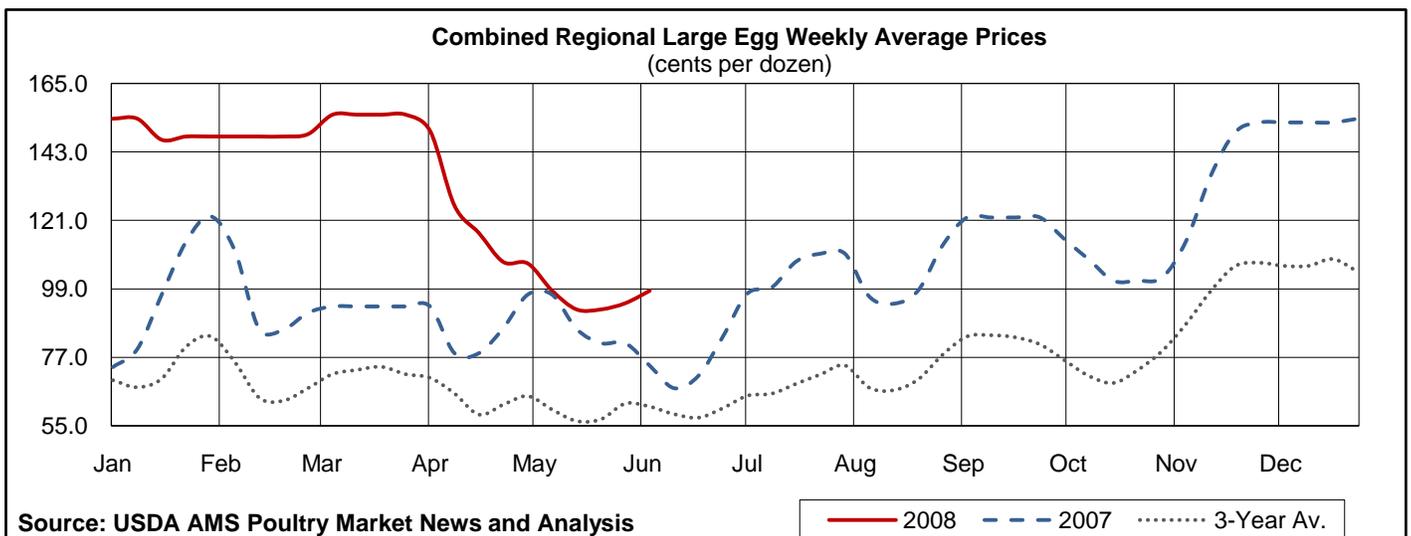
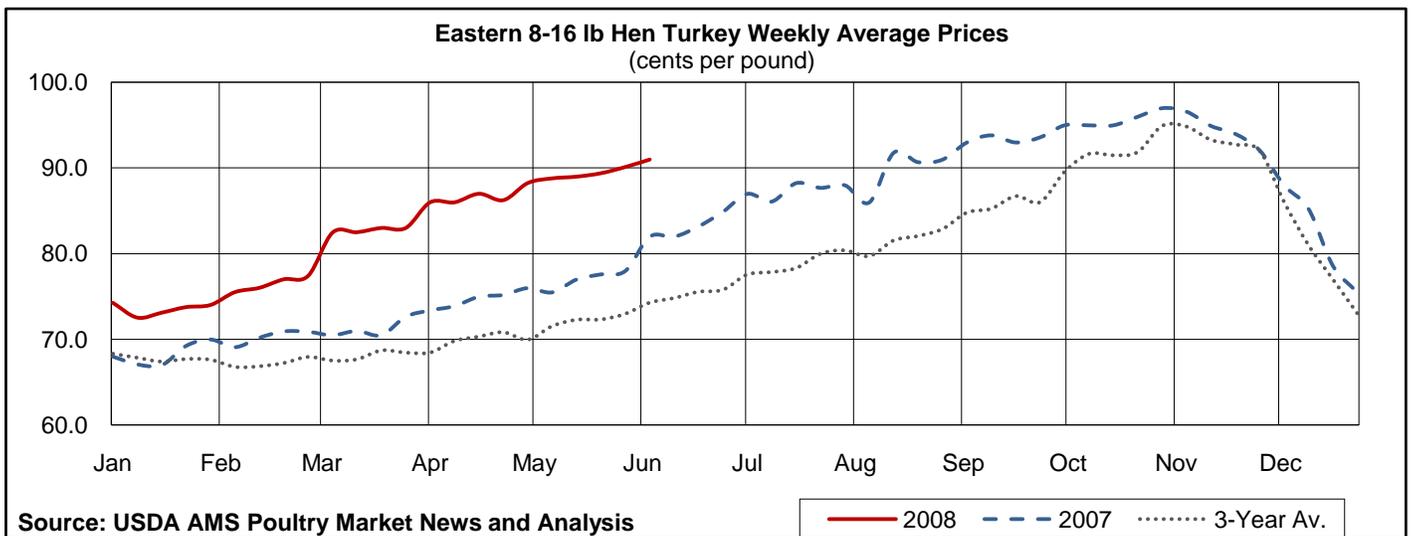
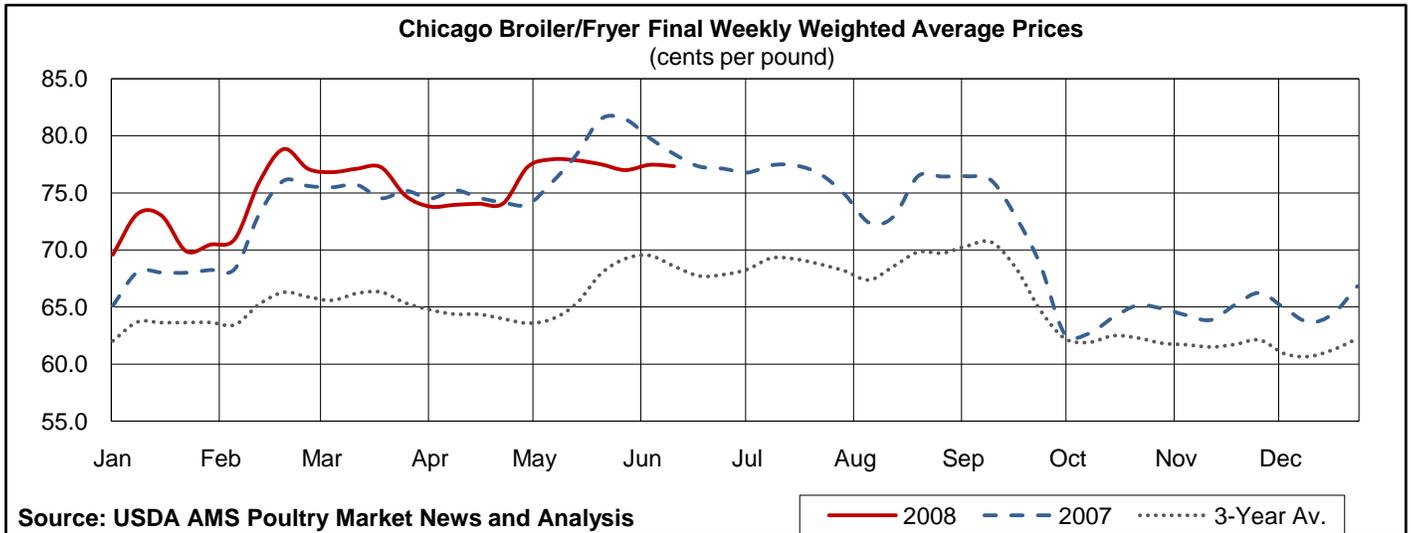
