



# USDA EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices were unchanged in all areas. Asking prices for next week's trading in most regions were trending higher on extra large and large eggs. Trade sentiment was steady to firm, with heavier weights in the best position. Demand into all channels was moderate to good. Supplies ranged sufficient to tight for trade needs. Major flooding in the Midwest region was causing store closures and transportation delays that could possibly slow production and delivery of eggs for upcoming week. Breaking stock offerings were usually short for regular processing schedules. Light type hen offerings were at least sufficient to ample for a moderate demand.

PRICES TO RETAILERS, SALES TO VOLUME BUYERS, USDA GRADE A AND GRADE A, WHITE EGGS IN CARTONS, DELIVERED WAREHOUSE, CENTS PER DOZEN.

**MIDWEST REGIONAL** Producer prices were higher for large and medium and unchanged for small. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged with asking prices for next week trending sharply higher. Trade sentiment was steady to instances firm. Cartoned egg demand was moderate to fairly good. Food service movement was usually moderate. Supplies were adequate to tight with the larger sizes in the closest position. Major flooding throughout the Midwest is causing store closures and major transportation delays that could slow production and delivery of eggs and egg products over the next week. Central states breaking stock prices were higher. Offerings were inadequate for the moderate to instances good demand. Floor stocks tight to closely balanced. Schedules full-time. Trade sentiment fully steady to firm.

**NORTHEAST REGIONAL** Prices were unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending sharply higher on heavier weight eggs. Trade sentiment was steady to at times firm. Retail and distributive demand ranged moderate to good. Supplies were closely balanced to instances tight for current buyer and seller needs. Eastern region breaking stock demand was moderate to fairly good for short offerings. Light type hen offerings were at least adequate for normal to heavy processing schedules.
