NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were unchanged in all areas when compared to early week. Trade sentiment was cautiously steady to about steady in the Northeast, steady to weak elsewhere. Retail and food service demand covered the full range with light buying interest. Supplies were mixed, mostly adequate to fully adequate to satisfy current trade needs. Floor stocks were balanced to occasionally long. In the parts structure, trading was light and selective. Breast items were adequate to ample, and often discounted to help move. Wings were mixed, but available and tenders were fully adequate. Dark meat items were better balanced and moving satisfactorily. In productions areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights varied, but were mostly desirable.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was light to fair at best as most dealers saw no need to extend floor stocks beyond regular commitments. Offerings of 3 pound and heavier sizes were available; lighter sizes were at least adequate. Movement through retail and distributive was fair. The market tone was cautiously steady. In the parts complex, breast items were fully adequate to readily available and competitively priced. Dark meat cuts were adequate. Wings were mixed but fully adequate for trade needs.

WESTERN REGION Preliminary majorities are unchanged from Monday's final. The market tone is steady on whole broilers, steady to instances weak on WOGs with heavier sizes weakest. Demand light to moderate with some buying hand to mouth for next week's needs. Offerings adequate to fully adequate. The market tone on breast items was steady to weak, wings and dark items mostly steady. Demand light to moderate. Offerings of breast items adequate to instances burdensome, wings and dark items adequate.

GEORGIA F.O.B. DOCK PRICES Georgia f.o.b. dock quoted price on broiler/fryers for this week's trading is 88.75 cents based on ice-packed USDA grade "A" sized 2 1/2 to 3 pound birds.

MIDWEST REGION Preliminary majority delivered prices on whole birds into the Chicago area for next week were unchanged. The market tone on whole broiler/fryers was steady to weak. Whole bird producer offerings were light on nonaggressive trade inquiry. Retail and food service movement was in a full range, mostly moderate to fairly good. Floor stocks were manageable; weights desirable. Part offerings were light overall going into weekend, but some in trade noted breast cuts remained available to at times ample. Trade sentiment was steady dark meat lines and wings; and steady to weak on breast cuts.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to no better than fair entering the weekend. Seller offerings were fully sufficient and were often noted with the 3.00 and heavier weights in the longest position. Live supplies were moderate; weights were usually desirable to heavy. Processor schedules ranged moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices continued unchanged at 72 to 84 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, breast items were fully adequate to readily available with discounting in an effort to stimulate buying interest. Wings were irregular. Dark meat cuts were adequate to balanced and moving satisfactorily.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Trade sentiment was about steady. Demand entering the weekend was light to fair with interest not meeting expectations. Supplies of all sizes were more than sufficient and often discounted to help move. In the parts structure, movement was more than adequate for late-week trading. Breast items were fully adequate to readily available and slow to clear. Tenders were in a slightly better position, and wings were irregular but available. Dark meat items remain in better balance to closely cleared. In productions areas, live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

Tenders were fully adequate and dark meat cuts were adequate and clearing satisfactorily. Retail and distributive movement was no better than fair. The market tone was barely steady to weak for breast items. Wings were no better than steady.
