## NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were unchanged in all areas when compared to early week. Trade sentiment was overall steady, at times about steady in the East. Retail and food service demand was in a full range, slow to instances good, best activity noted into retail and fast food promotions. Supplies were at least sufficient to satisfy current trade needs. Plants were taking a wait and see attitude for next week due to Hurricane Ike and the affects it may have in some areas. Floor stocks were well cleared to occasionally long. In the parts structure, trading was fair at best for late-week trading. Breast items were mixed, but available, with boneless skinless in the best position. Wings were irregular, ranging available to tight and dark meat items were in good supply and moving satisfactorily. In productions areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights varied, but were mostly desirable.

**SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER** Trade sentiment was about steady. Demand entering the weekend was light to fair, and usually limited to regular commitments. Supplies of all sizes were sufficient to fully sufficient to satisfy current trade needs. Plants are taking a wait and see attitude for next week due to predicted storms that may affect some areas. In the parts structure, movement was no better than fair for late-week trading. Breast items were at least adequate with cutlets and wings in a slightly better position. Dark meat items were adequate to no more than adequate and moving well. In productions areas, live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

**NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER** Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers increased slightly under normal weekend demand and was noted as no better than fair. Offerings of 3 pound and heavier sizes were available and slow to clear; smaller sizes were generally sufficient for current needs. Movement through retail and distributive channels was light to fair. Fast food interest was fair. The market tone was about steady. In the parts complex, dark meat cuts were adequate to well cleared with drums and thighs in the best position. Wings were in better balance and noted as seasonally active. Boneless skinless breast were improving and clearing satisfactorily.

**WESTERN REGION** Preliminary majorities were unchanged from last Monday. Whole broiler fryer trade sentiment was steady, WOGS steady to barely steady with 3 lb. and up WOGs sizes weakest. Offerings adequate to fully adequate with spot discounting noted on fill-in volumes of 3 lb. and heavier sizes. Demand was light to moderate with interest not up to expectations for some. Floor stocks adequate to instances longer than desired. Sizes desirable to sometimes heavier than desired. The market tone on breast meat was steady to barely steady, balance mostly steady. Supplies of breast meat were available, balance adequate. No delivery problems noted.

**MIDWEST BOILER/FRYER** Preliminary majority delivered prices on next week's trade into the Chicago market were unchanged. Whole broiler/fryer market tone was steady. Producer offerings were limited on small birds and fully adequate on heavy weights. Retail and food service was slow to fairly good and irregular in all markets; best activity noted into retail features, fast food promotions and downtown bars and restaurants. Floor stocks were well cleared to long; weights desirable to heavy. Trading on parts remained centered on wings, which were available to well cleared; boneless/skinless breast was clearing well and in better balance for needs over prior period; and dark meat lines were available. Many in industry were taking interest in hurricane Ike and concerned on effects it may have. Trade sentiment was steady to firm on wings and steady on all other parts.

**DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS** Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds increased slightly and was noted as light to moderate entering the weekend. Seller offerings were as least adequate and were more readily available on the 3.00 and 3.50 pound sizes. Live supplies were moderate; weights were desirable to heavy. Processor schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices continued unchanged at 72 to 84 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady to steady. In the parts complex, breast items were reported as at least adequate to fully adequate. Wings were mixed with the smaller sizes in the best position. Dark meat cuts were generally sufficient and moving satisfactorily.

**NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS** Trucklot buying activity improved slightly and was noted as generally fair entering the weekend. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts and tenders were in better balance and were at least sufficient for current needs; wings were seasonally active and clearing satisfactorily. Dark meat cuts were mostly adequate with thighs and drums in the better balance. Retail and distributive movement was fair. The market tone was steady and improving for boneless skinless breast; at least steady for wings.
