NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were trending lower in the East, but unchanged elsewhere when compared to early week. Trade sentiment was about steady in the East and West, steady in the Midwest. Demand into retail and food service channels was mostly slow to moderate. Supplies of all sizes were adequate to fully adequate, ample for heavier weights in the West. Floor stocks were balanced to long. In the parts structure, movement was slow to fair, slightly better where weekend needs increased. Wings were in the best position with supplies adequate to close balanced. Breast items were readily available with limited movement. Leg quarters were heavily discounted, and the remaining dark meat cuts were at least sufficient. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Trade sentiment was about steady. Demand entering the weekend was fair at best with limited trading. Supplies were at least adequate to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement was light to fair for late-week trading. Breast items were more than sufficient and slow to clear and wings were better balanced. Dark meat items were adequate to fully adequate and frequently discounted to help clear. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was light to fair at best as dealers kept floor stocks in close balance with immediate needs. Offerings of all sizes were fully sufficient for current needs. Movement through retail and distributive channels was light to fair. Fast food interest was fair. The market tone was about steady. In the parts complex, wings were clearing satisfactorily. Breast items and tenders were at least adequate to available. Legs, leg quarters and thigh meat were readily available and slow to clear.

WESTERN REGION The preliminary majority prices were unchanged. The market tone was overall steady. Early trading reported at mixed levels, unchanged to lower. Offerings were adequate to ample. Discounts were common place. Buyer's interest was only fair at best. Retailer demand was moderate overall. Trade sentiment was barely steady to very weak, with leg quarters in the weakest position. Dealers anticipated moderate weekend carryovers.

MIDWEST BOILER/FRYER Preliminary majority prices on next week's whole birds delivered into the Chicago market were unchanged. The market tone on whole broiler/fryers was generally steady. Retail and food service activity remained slow to moderate overall. Floor stocks were balanced to long; weights were mixed. Supplies of regular wings continued to be in close balance, all other parts plentiful. The trade sentiment was steady to fully steady on regular wings, about steady to weak on all other parts.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair at best entering the weekend. Seller offerings were more than sufficient for trade needs. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed, but reported as mostly desirable. Processor schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices remained unchanged at 70 to 82 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, breast items and dark meat cuts were at least adequate to readily available. Leg quarters were heavily discounted. Wings were generally sufficient and clearing satisfactorily.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS Trucklot buying activity increased slightly under normal weekend demand but still noted as light to no better than fair. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts were available with light movement; bone-in breast, tenders and most dark meat cuts remained at least adequate to available with legs, leg quarters and thigh meat noted as readily available. Wings were generally sufficient for current needs. Retail and distributive movement was light to fair, best where scattered features were noted. The market tone was barely steady for tenders and breast items; dark meat cuts were barely steady to weak. Wings were steady.
