NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices for next week were trending unchanged in the East, but lower elsewhere when compared to early week's prices. Trade sentiment was steady to about steady in the East, steady to weak in the Midwest and West. Retail and food service demand was light to moderate, best into fast food channels and where first of the month business was active. Supplies of all sizes were adequate to ample for current trade needs. Floor stocks were also adequate to ample. In the parts structure, movement was fair to moderate, slightly better where weekend needs increased. Boneless skinless breasts were close balanced to tight and often trading at premium levels. Tenders were at least adequate with limited interest, and the remaining breast items were sufficient. Wings were mixed, but available, and dark meat items were mostly adequate. In production areas live supplies were moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was no better than fair entering the weekend. Offerings of all sizes were fully sufficient for current needs. Movement through retail and distributive channels was light to fair. Fast food interest was fair to moderate. The market tone was about steady. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breasts were in close balance to tight. Tenders were at least sufficient for trade needs. Wings and most dark meat cuts were adequate to balanced.

MIDWEST BOILER/FRYER Preliminary delivered majority prices were down into the Chicago market on next week's deliveries. The market tone on whole broiler/fryers was steady to weak. Retail trade activity was light to moderate, and for the most part food service was the same. Sport bar restaurants and some fast food outlets were seeing fairly good interest. Floor stocks were in close balance to ample; weights desirable to heavy. Supplies of tender were more than sufficient other items ranged adequate to tight, especially boneless/skinless breast. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak on tenderloins, steady to firm on boneless/skinless breast and steady on the balance of parts.

WESTERN BOILER/FRYER Preliminary majority prices were 1 cent lower throughout the region. The market tone was weak. Trading reported on both new and regular commitments were at mainly lower prices overall. Offerings in fairly good balance on small sized product and generally long on heavy weights. Buying activity was light to moderate, with best interest noted where features planned. Retailer demand was moderate. Dealers anticipated satisfactory weekend carryovers. The market tone was generally steady on parts with some white meat items showing strength.

<u>SOUTHERN</u> <u>BROILER/FRYER</u> Trade sentiment was generally steady at best. Demand entering the weekend was light to moderate, best where first of the month business and fast food promotions were active. Supplies of all sizes were at least sufficient to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement was fair to moderate, slightly better where weekend needs increased. Breast items were sufficient to readily available, but boneless skinless was well cleared to tight and held with confidence. Wings and most dark meat items were in good supply and clearing satisfactorily. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

<u>DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS</u> Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds ranged light to moderate approaching the weekend. Seller offerings were fully sufficient to handle current trade needs. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed, but mostly desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices remained unchanged at 76 to 87 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady to steady. In the parts complex, b/s breasts were closely cleared to tight. Wings and dark meat cuts were balanced to well cleared.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS Trucklot buying activity increased slightly and was noted as fair to instances moderate entering the weekend. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts were closely cleared with premiums noted; bone-in breasts were sufficient for current needs. Dark meat items and wings were balanced to well cleared. Retail and distributive movement was light to fair to fair at best. The market tone was firm for boneless skinless breasts, mostly steady for the balance of items.
