NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Prices were unchanged in all locations entering the weekend. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady, with occasionally firm undertones. Demand into all channels ranged light to very good, mostly moderate to fairly good. Supplies were ample to at times close and held with confidence to satisfy current trade requirements. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to tight for normal processing schedules. Light type fowl offerings were generally sufficient for the mostly moderate demand.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Prices were unchanged. The trade sentiment was steady to mostly fully steady. Cartoned egg demand was moderate to at times very good and was showing signs of improvement as area wide feature activity that is planned for next week begins to clean up some of the excess supply. Loose egg movement was usually light. Supplies were barely adequate to instances tight and held with increasing confidence. Central states breaking stock prices were unchanged. Offerings were tight to adequate for the moderate demand. Schedules were full-time. The trade sentiment was steady with a firm

NATIONAL DRIED

Mostly prices were higher on whole, unchanged to higher on yolks, and lower on albumen when compared to last week's prices. Trade sentiment was mostly steady on whole and yolk, about steady to steady on albumen. Demand was moderate. Supplies were fully sufficient for immediate needs. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for week ending 28-Feb-2009 were 12% less than last week, although about the same as the previous year. The total year to date production of dried eggs produced was 7% higher than a year ago.

Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm for whole egg and steady on the balance of liquid products. Demand was fairly good to good for whole egg and whites as most operators divert shell eggs into graded channels and buyers reach out to fill liquid orders for next week. Yolk demand was light to moderate, instances fairly good. Offerings were tight to short of needs for whole egg and adequate for whites and yolk in most instances. Breaking stock prices were unchanged when compared to the past week's reported prices.
