Majority prices were trending higher in the Midwest, unchanged elsewhere when compared to early week prices. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady in all areas. Retail and food service demand was slow to moderate, mostly fair to moderate, best into fast food. Supplies of all sizes were adequate to fully adequate to satisfy current trade needs. Floor stocks were close balanced to long. In the parts structure, movement was fair to moderate for late week trading. Breast items and most dark meat cuts remained in good balance to well cleared and continue to move satisfactorily. Wings were mostly sufficient but noted in better balance. In production areas live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

<u>MIDWEST BOILER/FRYER</u> Preliminary majority delivered prices into the Chicago market area increased one cent. The market tone on whole broiler/fryers was steady to fully steady. Producer offerings were light to moderate on a like trade call. Retail and food service was slow to fairly good, best into fast food and some retail. Floor stocks were in close balance to long; weights desirable to heavy. Trade in the parts centered on eight-piece cutup and breast cuts. Parts supplies were in close balance. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm on dark meat lines and breast cuts, wings were steady.

WESTERN BOILER/FRYER Preliminary majority prices were unchanged. The market tone was generally steady to fully steady. Trading reported for next week's deliveries at mainly unchanged to higher prices; with new commitments in the strongest position. Offerings in close balance to fully adequate. Weights were somewhat heavier than desired to fulfill full trade needs. Buying activity was moderate. Retailer demand was overall moderate. Dealers anticipated desirable weekend carryovers.

**GEORGIA F.O.B. DOCK PRICES** Georgia f.o.b. dock quoted price on broiler/fryers for this week's trading is 85.75 cents based on icepacked USDA grade "A" sized 2 ½ to 3 pound birds.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was fair to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings of all sizes were generally sufficient for current needs. Movement through retail and distributive channels was fair. Fast food interest was fair to moderate. The market tone was at least steady. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breasts and most

dark meat cuts were in good balance to well cleared; bone-in breasts and wings were adequate to balanced and clearing satisfactorily.

**SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER** Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. Demand entering to weekend was mostly fair with trading usually limited to regular commitments. Supplies of all sizes were sufficient to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement was fair to moderate for late week trading. Breast items were in good supply and clearing satisfactorily. Dark meat cuts were balanced to well cleared with good movement and wings were sufficient. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

<u>DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS</u> Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings were generally sufficient. Live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights. Processing schedules ranged moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 71 to 82 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to instances fully steady. In the parts complex, all items were sufficient to well cleared.
