NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

New York prices were 1 cent higher on heavier weight eggs, unchanged on mediums when compared to the previous day's prices. Regional prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. Demand ranged light to very good, mostly moderate. Supplies varied, but overall tight to fully adequate for immediate trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to fully adequate for normal to overtime processing schedules. Spent hen offerings were sufficient to plentiful for the light to moderate demand.

Prices were unchanged to lower on whole and yolks, lower on albumen when compared to prices a week ago. Trade sentiment was about steady to steady. Demand was light as most trading was centered on immediate needs, however increased inquiry for future needs was noted. Supplies were sufficient for present requirements. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending 09-May-2009 was 9% more than last week, but 11% less than the same week the previous year. The total year to date production of dried eggs produced was 5% lower than a year ago.
