



U.S. – Korea Free Trade Agreement

The United States and the Republic of Korea signed a bilateral free trade agreement on June 30, 2007. Korea is a \$1 trillion economy and is the United States' 7th largest trading partner. In 2008, U.S. goods exports to Korea were \$34.8 billion. If approved, the Agreement would be the United States' most commercially significant free trade agreement in more than 16 years. This is the first U.S. FTA with a North Asian partner and could be a model for trade agreements in the rest of the region. The Agreement is currently pending Congressional approval.

Under the free trade agreement almost two-thirds (\$1.6 billion) of current U.S. farm exports will become duty-free immediately. Other farm products will benefit from expanded market opportunities with tariff phase-outs or through tariff rate quotas.

Korean tariffs on imports of chicken cuts, including the dominant U.S. frozen leg import category, will decline from the current 20 percent to zero in 10 equal annual reductions with the exception of frozen breast and wings, which will decline in 12 equal reductions. Korean tariffs on frozen turkey cuts will decline from the current 18 percent in seven equal annual reductions. Korean tariffs on egg products (egg yolks are the key import item) will decline from the current 27 percent in 12 equal annual reductions.

EU – Korea Free Trade Agreement

The EU and South Korea launched negotiations for an EU-Korea free trade agreement in May, 2007. South Korea is the EU's eighth largest trade partner and the EU has become South Korea's second largest export destination. In 2008 EU goods exports to South Korea totaled €25.6 billion; EU imports from South Korea totaled €39.4 billion.

The EU and South Korea already have a Framework Agreement on Trade and Co-operation, which has been in force since April 2001, aimed at fostering growth of two way trade and investment. An Agreement on Co-operation and Mutual Administrative Assistance in Customs Matters has been in force since 1997.

In July, 2009 the two countries concluded negotiation for the free trade agreement. The EU and South Korea will meet to clarify the technical language and the next step will be a legal review. The agreement requires legislative approvals by both sides and is expected to go into effect sometime in 2010.

In 2007 imports of agricultural products from South Korea ranked 79, valued at 134 million Euros and accounted for .3% of total agricultural product imports. European exports to South Korea ranks 16, valued at 1,222 million Euros and 4.9% of total agricultural exports.

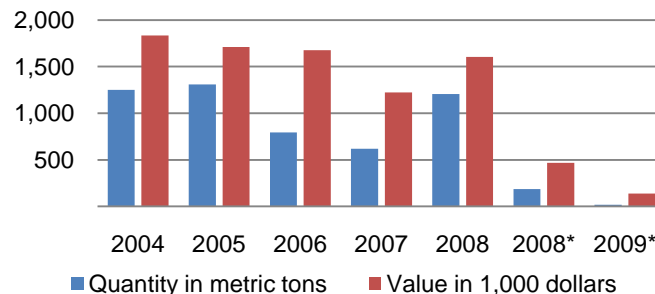

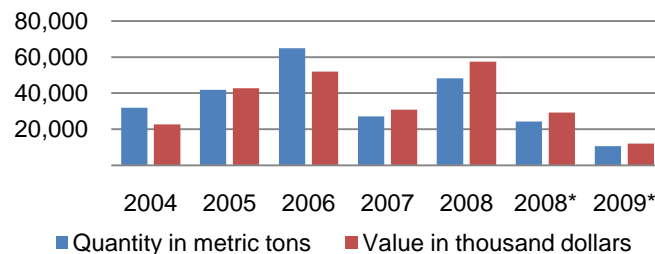

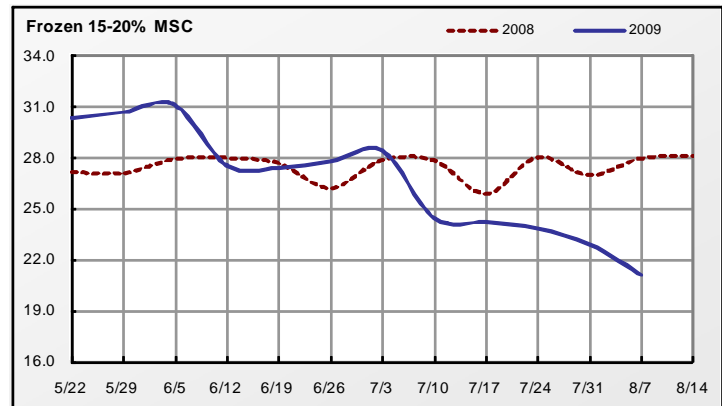
NATIONAL MECHANICALLY SEPARATED CHICKEN

(FOB Shipper Dock or equiv., negotiated prices in trucklot and less-than-trucklot volumes reported in thousand lb. quantities, cents/lb.; delivery within 2 weeks.)

The market tone was mostly barely steady to weak on all fat contents; undertone remains cautious and unsettled. Supplies of fresh and frozen 15-20% was adequate to available. The balance of fat contents was generally sufficient for needs. Cancellations continued to persist on regular contracts forcing more product onto the spot marketplace and creating challenges for most dealers. Raw material supplies were adequate to available with increased movement into other channels. Export and domestic demand was light to fair at lower trending prices. Schedules were normal. Frame values were barely steady to weak ranging mostly 7-9 cents FOB.

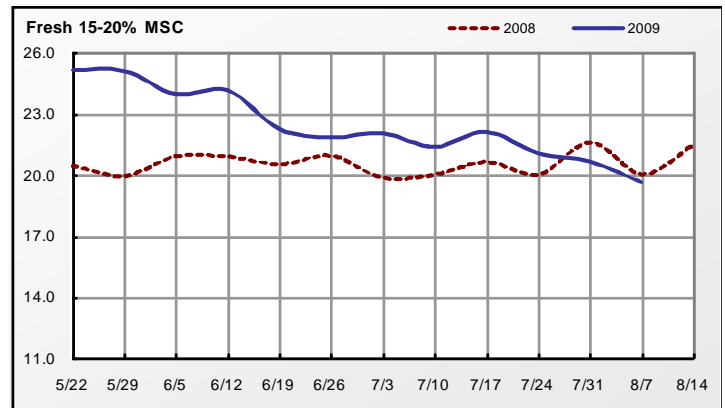

The market tone on tom bulk parts and mechanically separated turkey was mostly steady with some spot strength noted on drums into export channels. Demand was light to moderate while offerings were adequate. The trade sentiment on white meat items and thigh meat was steady. Demand was slow to moderate with offerings adequate. Some renewed interest was reported with the continuation of the bonus breast meat purchase. Domestic trading centered on drums, necks and MST. Export trading was heaviest on drums and tom V-wings. Domestic: fresh wing meat 108, fresh scapula meat 108, frozen tails 27 cents delivered. Export: fresh tom breast meat 139, fresh tom drums 52, frozen hen drums 51-52, wing meat 95, tom necks 27, tom gizzards (hand cut, hand defatted) 95-98 cents delivered border or port.
