NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were trending 2 cents lower in the Midwest, unchanged elsewhere when compared to early week. The market tone was steady to barely steady in the Midwest, steady to instances weak in the West, and steady in the East. Retail and food service demand was slow to moderate, mostly light to moderate. In parts of the East, securing trucks for transport continue to be an ongoing problem. Supplies of all sizes were mostly moderate to satisfy current trade needs. Floor stocks were in a full range. In the parts structure, movement was fair to moderate. Breast items and wings were moderate to instances heavy with discounting noted on boneless skinless. Dark meat items were mostly moderate and clearing well. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was light to fair entering the weekend as dealers kept floor stocks in close balance with immediate needs. Offerings of all sizes were generally sufficient for current needs. Retail and distributive movement was moderate. The market tone was steady. In the parts complex, supplies of bone-in breasts were about adequate and clearing satisfactorily; boneless skinless breasts, tenders and wings were moderate to heavy. Dark meat cuts were mostly moderate for current needs.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary majority delivered prices into the Chicago market were down 2 cents. The market tone on whole broiler/fryers was steady to barely steady. Whole bird offers were moderate on light fill-in trade call. Retail and food service movement was slow to moderate at best. Floor stocks were in a full range; weights mixed. Supplies of boneless/skinless breast and sometimes wings were plentiful, whole breast and tenders remained in close balance, leg quarters were building and all other parts were sufficient for current trade needs. The market tone was steady to weak on boneless/skinless breast, and steady to barely steady on the balance of items.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles preliminary majority was unchanged at 96 cents from Monday's final. The market tone on whole broiler fryers was mostly steady and WOGs steady to instances weak. Offerings adequate to fully adequate. Retail and food service demand light to moderate. Floor stocks and weights adequate. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts adequate to fully adequate and not as readily available as the early part of the week, tenderloins and bone-in breasts light, and wings adequate to sometimes fully adequate. Demand light to moderate. Dark and wing offerings adequate to instances fully adequate. The market tone on wings was steady, boneless skinless breasts barely steady at best, bone-in breasts and tenderloins steady. The market tone on dark items was cautiously steady to steady.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER The market tone was steady. Demand entering the weekend was moderate with limited trading. Supplies of all sizes were sufficient to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement was mostly moderate. Breast cuts were light to moderate with whole breast in the best position. Wings were moderate to more available with some discounting noted. Dark meat items were moderate. In production areas live supplies were moderate. Weights were mostly desirable.

<u>DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS</u> Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to moderate entering the weekend. Seller offerings were balanced to adequate for immediate trade needs. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed, but reported as mostly desirable. Processing schedules were moderately heavy with spot locations operating on Saturday. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 91 to 99 cents. The market tone was steady. In the parts complex, breast items and wings were moderate to at times heavy. Most dark meat cuts were light to moderate.

<u>NORTHEAST BROILER PARTS</u> Trucklot buying activity improved slightly under normal weekend demand and was noted as mostly fair overall. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts, tenders and wings were more than sufficient for current needs. Bone-in breasts and most dark meat cuts remained light to moderate. Retail and distributive movement was fair with the problem of securing trucks for transport and ongoing concern. The market tone was steady for most items.
