NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Preliminary prices are trending 2 cents lower in the Midwest, 1 cent lower in the East, and unchanged in the West when compared to early week. Offerings are light to heavy, mostly moderate to heavy for current trade needs. Retail and food service demand is light to fairly good, mostly light to moderate, best into resort areas. Floor stocks are close balance to long. The market activity is slow to moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are trending steady to firm on wings, steady to lower on all other parts. Offerings of wings and tenders are light with good movement. Offerings of boneless skinless breast are heavy and slow to clear and dark meat items are moderate to instances heavy. In production areas, live supplies are moderate. Weights are mostly desirable.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity for readyto-cook whole broiler/fryer was light to fair at best entering the weekend. Offerings of all sizes are moderate to heavy for current needs. Retail and distributive movement is fair. Market activity is slow. In the parts complex, supplies of wings, tenders and drums are light to moderate and clearing well; boneless skinless breasts are heavy. Bone-in breast and other dark meat cuts are moderate.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary prices were 2 cents lower into Chicago and TFEWR elsewhere. Whole broiler/fryer prices were trending barely steady to lower. Offers on whole birds were light to heavy with light trade interest noted. Parts prices were steady to barely steady on boneless skinless breasts, fully steady to higher on wings and steady on the balance of parts. Supplies of wings were light; all other parts moderate to instances heavy. Retail and food service demand was slow to moderate; fairly good demand noted into resort areas. Best movement noted on wings and eight piece cutup. Floor stocks were in close balance to long; weights mostly desirable.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles preliminary majority for next week is 97 cents, unchanged from last Monday's. The market on whole broiler fryers is mostly steady and WOGs are steady to weak. Offerings of whole fryers and WOGs moderate to moderately heavy. Retail and food service demand light to moderate with some finding interest slower than desired while others note improvement for the weekend. Floor stocks adequate to longer than desired. Weights desirable. The market on boneless skinless breasts is barely steady to weak, wings fully steady to firm and the balance of white items mostly steady for next week's deliveries. The market on dark items is steady to barely steady, instances weak. Demand light to moderate. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts moderate to moderately heavy, balance of white items light to moderate with wings held with the most confidence. Offerings of dark items moderate to sometimes moderately heavy.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Prices are trending weak to lower. Offerings are moderate to heavy for late week business. Demand entering the weekend is moderate with trading usually limited to regular commitments. Market activity is moderate to slow. In the parts structure, movement is moderate to instances good. Price trend on wings are steady to firm, steady to lower on breast items and steady on dark meat items. Offerings of wings are light to moderate. Offerings for all other parts are light to heavy with boneless skinless in the weakest position. In production areas, live supplies are light to moderate. Weights are desirable to light due to severe heat. The market activity is slow to moderate on parts.

<u>DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS</u> Less than trucklot asking prices are one cent lower at 88 to 97 cents. Prices are trending lower. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is fair to moderate entering the weekend. Seller supplies are readily available for current trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mostly desirable. Processor schedules are moderate. Market activity is moderate to slow. In the parts complex, supplies of drums and wings are light and moving well, frequently at premium levels. All other items are moderate and holding steady.

Offerings of wings, drums and tenders were light to moderate. Boneless skinless breasts were heavy for the lackluster demand. Retail and distributive movement was fair. Market activity was slow to moderate.
