NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

New York prices are 5 cents lower on Extra Larger, Large and Medium eggs. Regional prices are steady with a weak undertone. Retail demand is very light to light, while distributive demand is light to moderate. Current supplies are moderate to heavy for trade purposes. Market activity is slow. Breaking stock offerings are moderate to heavy for a generally light to moderate demand. Light type hen offerings are light to at least adequate; demand is light to moderate.

Shell Eggs Broken Up 2 Percent from Last Year

Shell eggs broken totaled 179 million dozen during July 2010, up 2 percent from July a year ago, but 4 percent below the 186 million broken last month.

July 2010 contained 22 weekdays (including one holiday) and 5 Saturdays. July 2009 contained 23 weekdays (including one holiday) and 4 Saturdays.

During calendar year 2010 through July, shell eggs broken totaled 1,182 million dozen, up 2 percent from the comparable period in 2009. To date, cumulative total edible product from eggs broken in 2010 was 1,541 million pounds, up 2 percent from 2009. Source: USDA/NASS
