#### **NATIONAL EGG REVIEW**

All reported prices are sharply lower. Next week's regional asking prices are trending significantly lower on all sizes. Retail demand is light to moderate with a substantial amount of feature activity planned for next week. Food service demand is light to instances moderate. Supplies remain heavy. Market activity is slow. Breaking stock prices, along with checks and undergrades, are slightly lower. Demand is light. Offerings are heavy. Supplies also remain heavy. Market activity is slow. North Central regional light type hen removal costs remain steady. Offerings are moderate for the moderate demand. Processing schedules are part-time to full-time. Market activity is moderate.

PRICES TO RETAILERS, SALES TO VOLUME BUYERS, USDA GRADE A AND GRADE A, WHITE EGGS IN CARTONS. PRICES DELIVERED TO WAREHOUSE, CENTS PER DOZEN.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Producer prices continue the downward trend with larger sizes 5 cents lower and medium and small sizes 1 cent lower. Midwest delivered prices are steady, but a sharply lower undertone is noted. Retail demand is light to moderate, while food service demand is light to moderate with instances moderate. Offerings are moderate to heavy. Market activity is slow. Breaking stock prices are steady to 1 cent lower with checks and undergrades down 2 cents. Offerings are heavy. Demand is light. Market activity is slow.

#### **WEEKLY FRYERS AVAILABLE FOR MARKETING**

Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for marketing during the week ending 23-Oct-10 is estimated at 156.8 million head. This compares to 156.6 million head the previous week and to 156.4 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 162.3 million head and the composite weighted average price was 69.91 cents per pound.
