NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Whole broiler/fryers are steady to barely steady in the West, steady elsewhere. Preliminary majority prices are unchanged in all areas. Offerings are light to moderate for the limited buyer interest. Retail and food service demand is light to moderate entering the weekend. Floor stocks are generally moderate. Market activity is seasonally slow to moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are trending steady to firm on breast items with whole breast in the best position and moving well. Wings are steady to weak and dark meat items are weak to lower. Offerings of breast are light to moderate, wings mostly moderate and dark meat moderate to heavy and slow to clear. The market activity is seasonally slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mostly desirable weights.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Prices are holding steady on all sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers is light to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings are generally sufficient for current needs. Trade activity is seasonally slow as other traditional holiday meat items become the essential point of the marketplace. In the parts complex, supplies of breast items are light to moderate and clearing satisfactorily. Wings are moderate and tenders and dark meat cuts are moderate to heavy with drums and thighs noted as available and slow to clear.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary majority delivered prices into the Chicago market unchanged. Whole bird offers light to moderate. Floor stocks in close balance by design; weights desirable to slightly heavy. Part prices steady to weak with dark meat cuts occasionally lower. Supplies of large and medium wings heavy, small wings limited and the balance of items moderate. Trade activity seasonally light on parts and whole birds with increased demand and movement of more traditional Thanksgiving items noted. Retail and food service demand slow to moderate at best.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles Friday Preliminary Majority is 95 cents, unchanged from last Monday's. The market on whole broiler fryers is steady and WOGs is steady to barely steady. Offerings light to moderate. Retail demand extremely light to instances moderate. Food service demand moderate to sometimes good. Floor stocks adequate. Weights desirable. The market on wings is steady to barely steady, bone-in breasts steady to firm and the balance of breast items steady to sometimes barely steady. The market on dark items is steady to sometimes weak. Demand light to moderate. Offerings of wings moderate, bone-in breasts light to moderate and the balance of white items mostly moderate with some increased availability noted going into the weekend as Thanksgiving rapidly approaches. Dark item offerings are moderate to moderately heavy. Retail movement light to moderate. Foodservice movement moderate with some slowing for next week's pre-Thanksgiving holiday demand.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Prices are trending steady for whole broilers and fryers. Offerings of all sizes are sufficient to satisfy trade needs. Pre-holiday demand entering the weekend is seasonally light to moderate with other holiday meat item the main focus. Market activity is moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week trading. Prices are trending steady for wings and breast items with whole breast in the best position. Dark meat cut are moderate to heavy and slow to clear. Market activity is moderate to at times slow. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mostly desirable weights.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Less-than-trucklot asking prices are unchanged at 78 to 90 cents, with a steady trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds ranged light to moderate entering the weekend as dealers continue to look to more traditional holiday meats. Offerings are sufficient to handle trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but noted as mostly desirable. Processing schedules are moderate. Market activity is seasonally slow to moderate. In the parts complex, breast items are light to moderate and clearing well. Supplies of dark meat cuts and wings are moderate to heavy.

Trucklot buying activity is light to moderate entering the weekend as dealers look to other traditional holiday meat items. Offerings of breast items are light to moderate and clearing well; wings are moderate. Dark meat cuts and tenders are moderate to mostly heavy. Trade activity is seasonally slow.
