NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Whole broiler/fryers prices are trending steady to weak in all areas. Preliminary majority prices are 3 cents lower in the Midwest and unchanged elsewhere when compared to early week prices. Offerings are light to heavy, mostly moderate to heavy entering the weekend. Retail and food service demand is light to moderate with some purchasing on an as needed basis. Floor stocks are adequate to long. Market activity is seasonally slow. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week trading. Prices are trending steady to firm for bone-in breast, steady to weak for b/s breast and tenders. Dark meat items are trending weak to lower with leg quarters in the weakest position. Wings are weak, but small wings are steady. Offerings of breast items are light to moderate, dark meat and tenders are moderate to heavy. Wings are heavy and slow to clear. Market activity is slow. In production areas, live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but noted as mostly desirable.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Prices are trending steady to weak on all sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers is light entering the weekend as dealers kept floor stocks in close balance with immediate needs. Offerings are moderate to heavy for current needs. Trade activity is slow. In the parts complex, supplies of bone-in breasts are moderate; dark meat cuts tenders and boneless skinless breast are moderate to heavy. Wings are available and slow to clear.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary majority delivered prices decreased 3 cent into the Chicago market. Whole broiler/fryer prices about steady to mostly lower. Whole bird offers light to moderate. Trade interest from buyers was light, cautious and price sensitive. Floor stocks adequate to long; weights desirable. In parts complex, small wing prices steady to firm, breast cuts mixed steady to weak and remainder of parts about steady to lower. Small wings are in close balance and wanted; other sizes ample and slow to clear, and the balance of parts in balance to moderate. Market activity was slow to light on parts. Fast food promotions continued good movement, other food service varied, light to good and retail trade slow to light.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles majority is 95 cents, unchanged from last Monday. The market on whole broiler fryers is steady at best and WOGs steady to weak. Offerings of whole broilers light to moderate and WOGs moderate to heavy. Retail and foodservice demand light to moderate with some purchasing hand to mouth. Floor stocks mostly adequate. Weights desirable. The market on bone-in breasts is mostly steady, wings mixed, boneless skinless breasts, tenderloins and dark items steady to weak. Demand light to moderate. Offerings of bone-in breasts mostly moderate, wings light to instances heavy. Dark item offerings are moderate to heavy. Retail and foodservice movement light to moderate.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Prices are trending weak for whole broilers and fryers. Offerings are moderate to heavy to satisfy trade needs. Demand is light to moderate entering the weekend. Market activity is slow. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are steady to instances firm for breast items with whole breast well cleared. All remaining parts prices are trending weak to lower. Offering of breast items are light to moderate, wings are heavy and dark meat items offerings are moderate to heavy. Market activity is slow. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mostly desirable weights.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Less-than-trucklot asking prices are unchanged at 78 to 90 cents, with a steady trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds increased slightly entering the weekend, but generally remained light and unaggressive. Seller offerings are moderate to heavy for present trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but reported as mostly desirable. Processing schedules are moderately heavy. Market activity is slow. In the parts complex, supplies ranged moderate to heavy.

NORTHEAST BROILER PARTS Prices are trending steady to firm for bone-in breasts; steady to weak for boneless skinless breast and tenders. Leg quarters, thighs and wings are weak to lower. Trucklot buying activity is light and generally unaggressive entering the weekend as dealers saw no need to extend floor stocks beyond regular commitments. Offerings of bone-in breast are moderate; tenders and most dark meat cuts are moderate to heavy. Thighs and wings are heavy with limited interest. Trade activity is slow.
