NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Whole broiler/fryer prices are one cent higher in the East and Midwest, but unchanged in the West when compared to early week's prices. Offerings of all sizes are light to moderate for trade needs. Demand is seasonally light to moderate, at times good into fast food channels. Floor stocks are in a full range. Market activity is slow to moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate. Prices for wings are steady to firm and all other items are mostly holding steady. Supplies are available with wings in the tightest position. Market activity is light to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary majority prices were 1 cent higher into Chicago compared to last Monday's numbers. Whole bird prices were steady to fully steady. Additional offers were light to moderate with light to fair buyer interest. Demand into retail and food service outlets was light to moderate with fast food demand normal to good. Floor stocks were balanced to long. Weights were mixed. Whole bird market activity was light to moderate. Parts supplies were light to moderate with wings in the tightest position. Prices trended firm on wings while dark meat items and breast cuts were steady to fully steady. Parts market activity was light to moderate and wings continued to be in strong demand.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Prices are trending steady for most sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers improved slightly but still noted as light to moderate overall. Offerings of all sizes are sufficient for current needs. Trade activity is seasonally slow to moderate. In the parts complex, offerings of wings are light to moderate and noted as marginally more available than the previous week. Other items are moderate for current needs.

<u>SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER</u> Whole broiler/fryer prices are steady. Offerings of all sizes are available to satisfy trade needs. Demand entering the weekend is seasonally light. Market activity is light to moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate. Prices for wings are steady to firm with the remaining items steady. Supplies of wings are light to moderate, breast cuts and dark meat items are mostly moderate. Market activity is moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate. Weights are mixed, but mostly desirable.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles preliminary majority is 99 cents, unchanged from last week. The market on whole fryers is steady to firm, mostly steady with spot trading noted at higher trending prices. The market on WOGs is steady to mostly firm with prices trending higher for next week, however some unsettledness was reported on over 3 lb. WOGs in parts of the area based on new offers made today. Offerings light to instances moderate with over 3 lb. sized WOGs the most available. Retail demand mixed ranging light to good, mostly light to moderate. Foodservice demand light to moderate. Some parts of California are still reporting scattered power outages in response to this week's wind storm. Floor stocks moderate to longer than desired. Weights desirable. The market on wings is firm, breast items steady to instances firm with most prices unchanged for next week's shipments. The market on dark items is steady with some finding a strengthening undertone on legs, leg quarters and drums. Demand light to good, mostly light to moderate with a few finding export interest on white items. Offerings of wing very light to light with the balance of items light to moderate. Movement light to good, mostly light to moderate.

<u>DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS</u>
remained unchanged at 78 to 84 cents with a steady trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is light to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings are sufficient for current trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but reported as mostly desirable. Processing schedules are moderate. Market activity is seasonally slow to moderate. In the parts complex, supplies are light to moderate.

Broiler/Fryer current negotiated prices for immediate delivery includes mostly multiple-drop shipments of branded and wing tagged to New York City from Delmarva.
