## NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Whole broiler/fryer prices are weak to lower in the East, barely steady to weak in the Midwest, and steady to weak in the West. Offerings cover the full range but are mostly moderate for current trade needs. Preliminary majority prices are sharply lower in the Midwest, 5 cents lower in the East, and unchanged in the West when compared to early week prices. Retail and foods service demand is light to moderate at best entering the weekend. Floor stocks are balanced to long. Market activity is mostly slow. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are trending steady to firm on all parts. Supplies of parts are light to moderate with wings beginning to show up. Market activity for parts is moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary majority were sharply lower again this week in Chicago. Whole bird prices are trending barely steady to weak. Additional offerings are mostly moderate to instances heavy. Retail and food service demand is light to moderate at best with fast food interest light to moderate. Floor stocks are balanced to long. Weights are mixed but trending heavy. Whole bird market activity is light to moderate. Supplies of parts are light to moderate with wings beginning to show up. Prices trending steady on all items with a firm undertone on dark meat items. `Parts market activity is light to moderate.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Prices continue to trend weak to lower for most sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers is light and unaggressive as dealers limited orders to regular commitments. Offerings of all sizes are available and slow to clear. Trade activity is slow. In the parts complex, offerings of tenders, wings and bone-in breast are light to moderate and moving well, boneless skinless breast and most dark meat cuts are adequate for current needs and noted in slightly better balance than a week earlier.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Prices for whole broiler/fryer continues to trend lower. Offerings are moderate to heavy for end of the month business. Demand into all channels is light entering the weekend. Market activity is slow. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are trending firm for tenders and wings, steady to firm for breast items and dark meat cuts. Offerings are light for wings and tenders with good movement, breast items and dark meat items are moderate. Market activity is slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mostly desirable weights.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles preliminary majority is 102 cents, unchanged from last Monday's final. The market on whole fryers is steady at best. The WOG market is weak with prices lower for next week's shipments. Offerings moderate. Retail and foodservice mostly light to moderate. loor stocks moderate to longer than desired. Weights desirable. The market on boneless skinless breasts is steady at best with prices mostly unchanged; bone-in breasts, wings and tenderloins steady to firm with prices unchanged to higher, mostly unchanged for next week's shipments. The market on legs and leg meat is steady to weak with prices unchanged to lower, balance of dark items steady for next week's deliveries. Demand mostly light to moderate. Offerings light to moderately heavy, mostly light to moderate. Movement mostly light to moderate.

<u>DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS</u> Less-than-trucklot asking prices are 1 cent lower at 90 to 95 cents with a weak to lower trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is light and unaggressive entering the end of the month. Offerings of all sizes are available and competitively priced. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but reported as desirable. Processing schedules are moderate. Market activity is slow. In the parts complex, offerings are light to moderate with wings and tenders in the tightest position.

Broiler/Fryer current negotiated prices for immediate delivery includes mostly multiple-drop shipments of branded and wing tagged to New York City from Delmarva.
